

- I. Arming Ourselves with the <u>Attitude</u> of Christ (vv. 1-2)
- ➤ To "arm yourself" means to arm oneself with <u>weapons</u> or to put on as armor. The picture is that of preparation for <u>battle</u>!

## Romans 8:16-17

The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, heirs also, heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, <u>if indeed</u> we suffer with Him in order that we may also be glorified with Him.
