Faith to Move Mountains Mark 11:19-26

II. Jesus' Exhortation (22)

- There are two primary expressions of faith...
 - o 1) Confidence in God's clear biblical promises to me
 - 2) Confidence that God has the capacity to do whatever I ask of Him if He decides that it is best for me

II. Jesus' Application (23-24)

 Cf. Matt. 21:21 - Jesus answered and said to them, "Truly I say to you, if you have faith and do not doubt, you will not only do what was done to the fig tree, but even if you say to this mountain, 'Be taken up and cast into the sea,' it will happen.



IV. The Limitations (25-26)

- 1) Have faith in God.
- 2) Have a spirit of forgiveness toward others.
- **3)** Ask.
- o Matt. 7:7; Jam. 4:2b You do not have because you do not ask.
- 4) Not ask with wrong motives and to consume it on our pleasures.
- o Jam. 4:3 You ask and do not receive, because you ask with wrong motives, so that you may spend it on your pleasures.

IV. The Limitations (25-26)

- **5)** Ask in Jesus' name.
 - John 14:13-14 "Whatever you ask in My name, that will I do, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. If you ask Me anything in My name, I will do it. 16:23
- 6) Abide in Jesus and have His Words abiding in you.
 - John 15:7 "If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you; 1 John 3:22
- 7) Delight ourselves in God.
 - Ps. 37:4 Delight yourself in the LORD; And He will give you the desires of your heart.

IV. The Limitations (25-26)

- 8) Ask according to God's revealed will (His Word).
 - o 1 John 5:14-15 This is the confidence which we have before Him, that, if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. $^{15}\,\rm And$ if we know that He hears us in whatever we ask, we know that we have the requests which we have asked from Him.
- 9) Ask in line with God's sovereign will.
- Luke 22:42 Father, if You are willing, remove this cup from Me; yet not My will, but Yours be done."
