Memory Verse: John 7:37 Now on the last day, the great *day* of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to Me and drink.

<u>Theme:</u> Jesus calls those who are spiritually thirsty to believe in Him to receive everlasting life. The response to His invitation creates division between those who believe in Him and those who reject Him. In our verses today, the crowd is divided, the officers are ineffective and the Pharisees are frustrated by the invitation of Jesus Christ.

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<u>Thirsty</u>: physically - the desperate need for water for parched mouths in the wilderness spiritually - the desperate need of spiritual life for sinners under God's wrath

Lenski: Spiritual thirst does not emanate from ourselves but, like coming and drinking, is the effect of the presence of Jesus, of His call and offer of living water (grace and salvation). He awakens the desire for spiritual satisfaction, even as he also satisfies this desire.

2. Jesus calls sinners to ______ to Him.

<u>Come:</u> physically -- the act of going to the source for water spiritually -- the act of going to Jesus, as the only means of salvation.

<u>**Drink:**</u> physically -- the act of partaking of water to maintain life spiritually -- the act of trusting in Christ for salvation and His sacrifice for our sin
