

SUPREME PROVIDENCE:

Bottom Line: God is in control! Scripture is a written record of God's pledge to redeem man's sinful and rebellious state for His glory and honor.


MIRACLES:

Grudem defines a miracle as follows:


- "A miracle is a <u>less common</u> kind of God's activity in which he arouses people's awe and wonder and bears witness to himself?"
