

# That Times of Refreshing May Come From the Presence of the LORD

Acts 3:1-26



"Christianity is unique. It is historical. It is phenomenal. It is primarily something that is done and then is followed by the teaching that explains what has happened."




Theme: The Lord uses providential phenomena to get the attention of people to hear the clear message of the Gospel




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


#### Herod's Temple on the Temple Mount

King Herod the Great began renovations on the Temple in approximately 20–19 BC. The entire temple expansion, including the massive Temple Mount, was not complete until approximately AD 62–64, only to be destroyed by the Romans in AD 70.







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- 7. The people <u>recognized</u> the man as the lame-from-birth beggar and were <u>amazed</u> and <u>bewildered</u> at what had happened this man

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- 4. Second, Peter directs the people to the <u>Lord Jesus</u> <u>Christ</u> whom the God of their fathers calls <u>His Servant</u> (v. 13, 26) and has <u>glorified</u> and whom they have <u>disowned</u>

Isaiah 52:13 - Behold, My servant will prosper, He will be high and lifted up and greatly exalted.

Isaiah 53:11 - As a result of the anguish of His soul, He will see it and be satisfied; By His knowledge the Righteous One, My Servant, will justify the many, As He will bear their iniquities.

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- 5. Twice Peter charges the people that they had "disowned" the Lord Jesus Christ

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- 8. Peter then connected the <u>miracle</u> of the man healed with the <u>Lord Jesus Christ</u> and <u>faith in His name</u>
- 9. Peter conceded that the people and the rulers had acted in <u>ignorance</u> but nonetheless, God has fulfilled the prophecies that <u>His Messiah would suffer and die for the sins of His people</u>

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so that God may send Jesus the Christ, <u>appointed</u> beforehand for you, to restore all things

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- 2) There is <u>blessing</u> for those who will receive it from the <u>Seed of Abraham</u>, who is Jesus Christ
- 12. God sent His servant <u>first</u> to Israel to bless them by <u>calling them to repentance</u>
