Implications:

- 1) Salvation is for a purpose! True salvation results in the believer's service for God's glory.

- 2) Proclaim the gospel message in your spheres of influence regardless of the cost.

- 3) Do the work of a skillful "seed flinger" and let God deal with the transforming impact of the gospel on the human heart. Never dismiss someone's potential for saving grace.

- 4) Remember that God ALWAYS works persecution in your life and in the lives of those He is calling for His perfect result. Unredeemed eyes are always focused on God's servants, and your reaction to persecution may serve as a catalyst to show the reality of a transformed life.
