**Key Verse:** Acts 22:14 And he said, "The God of our fathers has appointed you to know His will and to see the Righteous One and to hear an utterance from His mouth."

<u>Theme</u>: God convicts a person of their sin, leads them to repentance, chooses them for salvation and calls them to good works.

# I. Life Prior to Christ

21:27-22:5

Paul emphasized his attributes he shared with his audience

- 1. A Jew, born in Taursus and raised in Jerusalem
- 2. Highly educated in the Law by the preminent teacher
- 3. Dedicated service to God publicly displayed in persecuting Christians

# II. Salvation in Christ

22:6-16

Paul emphasizes God's work in salvation. Paul was helplessness as Jesus displayed His supernatural power.

- 1. Jesus reveals to Paul that he is persecuting Him by persecuting Christians
- 2. Paul was informed that God had appointed him for salvation.
- 3. Paul was called to be a witness of Jesus Christ to all men.
- 4. Paul was instructed to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ.

III. Life After Christ 22:17-21

Paul emphasizes his obedience to the instructions he is given by the Lord While praying in the temple Paul was told to

- 1. Leave Jerusalem immediately
- 2. Your testimony of Jesus Christ will not be believed in Jerusalem
- 3. Go far from Jerusalem and share My gospel with Gentiles

## **IV.** Response to the Gospel

22:22-29

- 1. The mob called for Paul's execution for his implication that the Gentiles were equal to the Jews in God's plan of salvation.
- 2. The commander responded in frustration at his inability to discover the crime committed by Paul
- 3. Paul appeals to Roman justice to avoid a tortuous interrogation.

### V. Application

- 1. God was in control of the circumstances that result in our persecution.
- 2. Our difficulties create opportunities to testify of the gospel of Jesus Christ
