Gospel's Proclamation World Acts 28:30-31 to present

<u>Section Verse:</u> "And Paul stayed two full years in his own rented quarters and was welcoming all who came to him, preaching the kingdom of God and teaching concerning the Lord Jesus Christ with all openness, unhindered." (Acts 28:30-31)

Section Theme: Be faithful to communicate the gospel in your spheres of influence (Matthew 28:18).

Dr. James Boice: At one period of history there may be a great moving of God's Spirit, and everything will seem to be going well. At other times the response to spiritual things is superficial or people are hostile to the gospel. But, in one sense, it really doesn't matter. What does matter is whether we are faithful in the calling to which God has called us. The Lord Jesus told his disciples, "The Gospel of the kingdom will be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all nations, and the end will come." (Matt 24:14). That end has not yet come, so you and I have the task of preaching it until then. Will we? Will we be found faithful? That is the theme of Acts!
