
#### THEME:

Theme: "Historically, Israel faced questions concerning its stability and longevity as a nation. While Isaiah may have penned these first chapters before King Uzziah's death (1-5), the threat of the rising superpower Assyria would have been felt. At the end of his reign, the northern kingdom began to collapse (2 Kings 15:13-19). Only a matter of time remained before the southern kingdom (Judah) would face the same fate." (Dr. Abner Chou)

Question: How could such a looming threat of ultimate destruction be harmonized with God's promises to Abraham and David of a great nation, peace, and a kingdom.






