


Isaiah 53:9

9 His grave was assigned with wicked men, yet He was with a rich man in His death, because He had done no violence, nor was there any deceit in His mouth.

Isaiah 52:13-15

13 Behold, My servant will prosper, He will be high and lifted up and greatly exalted.

14 Just as many were astonished at you, My people, so His appearance was marred more than any man and His form more than the sons of men

15 Thus He will sprinkle many nations, Kings will shut their mouths on account of Him; for what had not been told them they will see, and what they had not heard they will understand.

Isaiah 53:1-3

1 Who has believed our message? and to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?

2 For He grew up before Him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of parched ground; He has no stately form or majesty that we should look upon Him, nor appearance that we should be attracted to Him.

3 He was despised and forsaken of men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and like one from whom men hide their face, He was despised, and we did not esteem Him.

Isaiah 53:4-6

4 Surely our griefs He Himself bore, and our sorrows He carried; yet we ourselves esteemed Him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.

5 But He was pierced through for our transgressions, He was crushed for our iniquities; the chastening for our well-being fell upon Him, and by His scourging we are healed.

6 All of us like sheep have gone astray, Each of us has turned to his own way; But the Lord has caused the iniquity of us all to fall on Him.

Isaiah 53:7-9

7 He was oppressed and He was afflicted, Yet He did not open His mouth; like a lamb that is led to slaughter, and like a sheep that is silent before its shearers, so He did not open His mouth.

8 By oppression and judgment He was taken away; And as for His generation, who considered that He was cut off out of the land of the living for the transgression of My people, to whom the stroke was due?

Theme Statement

The Sovereign and Holy LORD God owns His people and thus will keep His covenant promises for His own glory and purposes in spite of the failure of His people but will in the interim punish His people for their ongoing sin and rejection of Him.

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Isaiah 42:19-20

Who is blind but My servant, or so deaf as My messenger whom I send? Who is so blind as he that is at peace with Me, or so blind as the servant of the Lord? You have seen many things, but you do not observe them; your ears are open, but none hears.

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4. Israel is called to <u>witness</u> to what they have seen and heard as the servant of the LORD

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1. The LORD God promises to destroy the <u>Babylonian Empire</u>

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1. The LORD God promises to destroy the <u>Babylonian Empire</u>

2. The pattern of deliverance from Babylonian captivity is the same as the miraculous deliverance from Egypt but the end result will be something new

1. The people were <u>abandoning</u> the LORD God and the sacrificial system

Jeremiah 2:11-13

"Has a nation changed gods when they were not gods? But My people have changed their glory for that which does not profit. Be appalled, O heavens, at this, and shudder, be very desolate," declares the Lord. "For My people have committed two evils: They have forsaken Me, the fountain of living waters, to hew for themselves cisterns, broken cisterns that can hold no water."

1. The people were <u>abandoning</u> the LORD God and the sacrificial system

2. The LORD God was wearied with all their continued sin

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- 3. Even so, the LORD God will provide a just way to forgive the sin of His people in concert with His own purposes

John MacArthur (re: Isaiah 43:25)

"This verse is probably the high point of grace in the OT. In spite of Israel's utter unworthiness, the Lord in His grace has devised a way that He can forgive their sins and grant righteousness without compromising His holiness. This He would accomplish through the work of His Servant. In spite of her failures, Israel will always be God's chosen people."

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4. The LORD God offers to listen to their arguments but reminds them of the pattern of sin from the beginning

5. In the end, the LORD God will save His people but in the interim, they will experience His current <u>discipline</u> for sin

1. Be thankful that we belong to Jesus Christ, that He loves us and that He never leaves us

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2. Be a faithful witness of the faithfulness of our LORD God

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4. Be sure of your salvation in Jesus Christ
