

Epistle to the Hebrews


Summary

The theme of the epistle to the Hebrews is the superiority of Jesus Christ. That is abundantly clear. What is not clear is who the author is and specifically to whom the epistle was written. In contrast to other New Testament epistles, the author is not named. Scholars have suggested the apostle Paul, Luke, Philip, Barnabas, Apollos, Aquila or possibly a woman such as Priscilla. But there has never been a consensus supporting the authorship of any of these possibilities. Dr. S. Lewis Johnson notes that according to the opening verses, the writer pens that "God.....has spoken to us in His Son" and in the 30 plus quotes from the Old Testament, the writer never mentions human authors with the exception of God speaking through David (Hebrews 4:7). Three times in the gospels, the Father audibly speaks and each time, He glorified His Son, Jesus Christ. It is entirely possible that the human author of Hebrews has been hidden in order to emphasize the divine authorship of the message, and what greater authority is there to decree and proclaim the superiority of Jesus Christ than God Himself!

To whom was the epistle to the Hebrews written? Dr. John MacArthur states, "When the various NT books were formally brought together into one collection shortly after A.D. 100, the titles were added for convenience. This epistle's title bears the traditional Greek title, 'To the Hebrews,' which was attested by at least the second century A.D. Within the epistle itself, however, there is no identification of the recipients as either Hebrews (Jews) or Gentiles. Since the epistle is filled with references to Hebrew history and religion and does not address any particular Gentile or pagan practice, the traditional title has been maintained........Emphases on the Levitical priesthood and on sacrifices, as well as the absence of any reference to the Gentiles, support the conclusion that a community of Hebrews was the recipient of the epistle."

Some scholars have suggested that the message of Hebrews is the same message Jesus delivered to some of His disciples on the road to Emmaus. Those disciples were in danger of abandoning Jesus Christ and returning to Judaism so Jesus said to them, "O foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken! Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?' Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures" (Luke 24:25-27). Similarly, Hebrews was written to comfort the Jewish believers in their persecution and to prevent them from returning to Judaism. It was also written to unbelieving Jews, some of whom were intellectually convinced but spiritually uncommitted. The main point is that Jesus Christ is so far superior to every aspect of Judaism that, in rejecting Him and/or returning to Judaism, they were choosing to follow an inferior and powerless system. A key word in Hebrews is "better." The epistle moves through the main features and persons of the Old Testament and demonstrates that Jesus Christ is better than all of them. Jesus Christ is better than the prophets, better than the angels, better than Moses, better than Joshua, better than Aaron and better than the Levitical priesthood. Jesus Christ brings a better covenant and is a better "once for all" sacrifice resulting in a better rest. Further since, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8) and He is the eternal infinite God, He cannot be "bested."

What a vital message this is for us to heed today for it is God Who has spoken through His Son! "God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, in these last days has spoken to us in His Son" (Hebrews 1:1-2), and God the Father has said, "This is My beloved Son, listen to Him!" (Mark 9:7)

"God has Spoken"

"This initial affirmation is basic to the whole argument of this epistle, as indeed it is basic to the Christian faith. Had God remained silent, enshrouded in thick darkness, the plight of mankind would have been desperate indeed; but now he has spoken His revealing, redeeming, and life-giving word, and in His light we see light. Our author is not thinking of that general revelation of Himself which God has given in creation, providence and conscience —

'Lo, these are but the outskirts of His ways; and how small a whisper do we hear of Him?' (Job 26:14)

but of that special revelation which He has given in two stages: first, to the fathers through the prophets, and finally in His Son."


