Hebrews 2:1-4

### Do Not Neglect this Great Salvation!

- Argument 1: Consider Jesus, through whom this salvation comes (1)
  - God has spoken through His Son as His ultimate revelation
  - Jesus is:
    - God's unique Son
    - The heir of all things
    - The Creator of the universe
    - The radiance of God's glory
    - The exact representation of God's nature
    - The One who upholds all creation by His word
    - The One who died for our sins
    - The One who sits at the right hand of the Majesty on high
    - The One who is superior to the angels and whom angels worship and serve
    - The One who is everlasting and unchangeable

### Do Not Neglect this Great Salvation!

- Argument 1: Consider Jesus, through whom this salvation comes (1)
- Argument 2: Consider the judgment to come (2-3a)
  - Angels mediators of the Law
    - Psalm 68:17
    - Deuteronomy 33:2
    - Acts 7:38
    - Acts 7:53
  - The Law specified just penalties for every infraction
  - The argument from the lesser to the greater: how much greater will the penalty be for neglecting so great a salvation?

### Do Not Neglect this Great Salvation!

- Argument 1: Consider Jesus, through whom this salvation comes (1)
- Argument 2: Consider the judgment to come (2-3a)
- Argument 3: God Himself has confirmed the gospel is true (3b-4)

Acts 2:22 "Men of Israel, listen to these words: Jesus the Nazarene, a man attested to you by God with miracles and wonders and signs which God performed through Him in your midst, just as you yourselves know..."

Acts 2:43 "Everyone kept feeling a sense of awe; and many wonders and signs were taking place through the apostles."

## Summary / Application

- Why the gospel message must not be ignored:
  - It flows from the person and character of the Lord Jesus Christ and the saving work He has done
  - To ignore it is to disregard our only hope of salvation and to face God's just penalty, which is eternity in hell
  - God has provided overwhelming evidence that the message of Jesus and His apostles is absolutely true, and therefore must be embraced with all seriousness and a true commitment to Jesus as Lord
