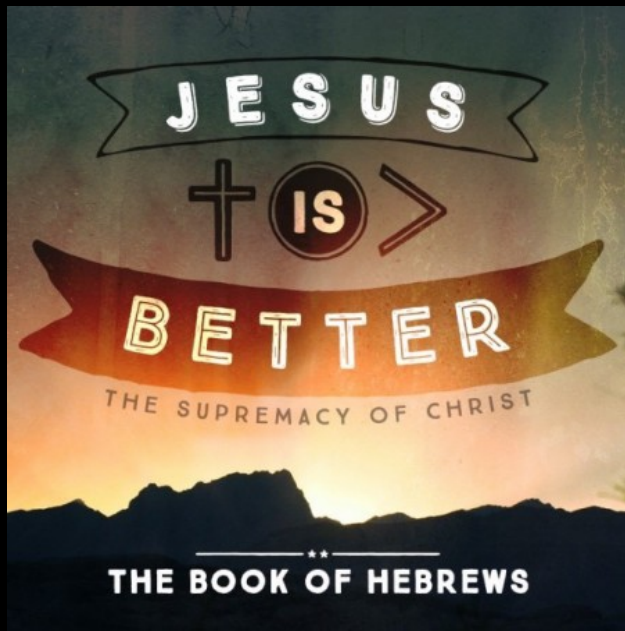

THEMES OF HEBREWS 2:10-18

1) How does the crucifixion of Christ on the cross glorify God? Our Lord's death, burial, resurrection, and exaltation display the splendor and majesty of God's perfect attributes more than anything else in the universe.

2) What is our greatest need? Our greatest need is to be reconciled to our holy God. Have you come to Jesus in faith, knowing that He is your propitiation, the One who bore the penalty that you deserve?

3) If you do know Him as your High Priest, are you crying out to Him for help when you are tempted? He is your merciful and faithful High Priest. Are you seeking His aid when you are tempted?

“10 For it was fitting for Him, for whom are all things, and through whom are all things, in bringing many sons to glory, to perfect the author of their salvation through sufferings.”

“17 Therefore, He had to be made like His brethren in all things, so that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. 18 For since He Himself was tempted in that which He has suffered, He is able to come to the aid of those who are tempted.”

COMPARISON BETWEEN JESUS AND THE ANGELS

Jesus is sitting as King, angels are sent as servants.

There is only one King but there are many servant angels.

Angels are ministering servants of Christians (6:12).

Christ is the King over the church; angels do his bidding for the church.

Jesus is the Son of God in such a way that no angel can ever compare.

Jesus is not an angel rather he is worshiped by angels (6).

Jesus is not an angel; he is God incarnate (8).

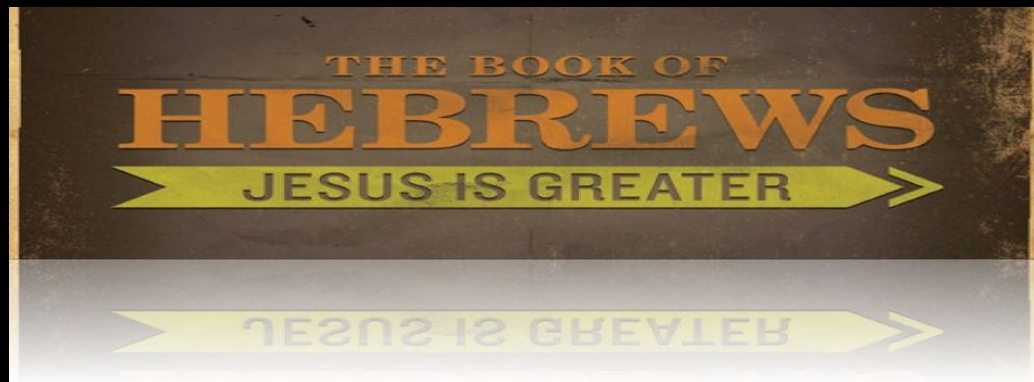
Jesus is not an angel rather He is the eternal Creator of all things (10).
