    - 1. If you present yourself as a slave to something or someone, you are a slave.
    - 2. In the spiritual realm, there are only two masters.
    - 3. You can only be a slave to one of those two masters.
    - 4. You can only identify your master by what you do.
    - 5. These two kinds of slavery result in two radically different ends.

  - A. Our Condition before Salvation: We Were Slaves of Sin (17a).
  - B. The Change at Salvation: We Were Regenerated by God (17b).
  - C. Our Condition after Salvation: We Were Made Slaves of Righteousness (18).
    - 1. Freed from our Old Master (18a)
    - 2. Enslaved to our New Master (18b)

## Profound Differences between human slavery and our slavery to God...

- 1. We are not merely slaves, but adopted children of the Father, friends and even brothers and sisters of our new Master (8:15; Jn. 15:12-15).
- 2. Our new Master's commands are light and true freedom (Jn. 8:31-32; Mt. 11:30; 1 Jn. 5:3).
- 3. Our new Master loved us so much He offered His own life to redeem us (1 Pet. 1:18-19).
