The Faith of Daniel

Some Basic Daniel Bio Facts:

Born shortly after time of Josiah's reforms beginning in 630 BC

Among select Jewish youths in first exile to Babylon in 605 BC

Age at deportation: teenager (probably 13-15 years old)

Entered government service in 602 BC


Served in Babylonian and Persian Empires for at least 66 years

"Daniel and his three friends Hananiah, Azariah and Meshael exemplified faithful living in exile, and provide models of how God's people today should live as strangers and exiles in a world not their home." (ESV Study Bible notes)

The Faith of Daniel

Positions Daniel held in the Babylonian Empire:

Entered the king's personal service, 1:19

Ruler over the Province of Babylon itself, 2:48


Chief Prefect over all the wise men of Babylon, 2:48

Remained in king's court, to personally serve the king, 2:48

Personal adviser to the king, interpreting dreams and signs, 3 & 4

Third Ruler in the Entire Empire of Babylon, 5:29

(for a few hours)



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Positions Daniel held in the Persian Empire

One of three commissioners over the 120 satraps (governors) who administrated the Persian Empire, 6:2.

To be appointed as lead over the entire empire, 6:3

- I Taken into Exile, vs 1-7
 - The Criteria for selecting the exiles
 - Youths young, adolescent males, probably 13 15 years old.
 - No physical defects.
 - " Good-looking.
 - " Intelligence in every branch of wisdom.
 - Endowed with understanding and discerning knowledge.
 - Ability for serving in the king's court.

II Remained Undefiled, vs 8-16

Daniel 1: 8

But Daniel made up his mind that he would not defile himself with the king's choice food or with the wine which he drank.

Daniel's problem

The food was not kosher

The food had likely been offered to idols

Ashpenaz's problem

He could lose his head if Daniel and friends did not appear healthy

The request to the overseer

Test us for 10 days on vegetables and water

The result of the test

Better physical appearance than those eating the choice food

III Promoted and Preserved, vs 17-21

God gave these four youths knowledge and intelligence in every branch of literature and wisdom.

Daniel even understood all kinds of visions and dreams.

The four passed training with flying colors

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God gave these four youths knowledge and intelligence in every branch of literature and wisdom.

Daniel even understood all kinds of visions and dreams.

The four passed training with flying colors – without comparison among other trainees.

The four then entered the king's personal service, and there distinguished themselves as 10 times better than their counterpart false religious counselors.
