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Two Contrasting Parabolas



The Great Parabola of Scripture

Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of bond-servant, and being made in the likeness of men Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross (Phil. 2:5-8).

For this reason also, God highly exalted Him, and bestowed on Him the name which is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee will bow of those who are in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and that every tongue will confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father. (Phil. 2:9-11)

In those seven verses Paul teaches us...

From Glory to Glory

- the divinity of Christ,
- His eternal preexistence,
- · His equality with God the Father,
- · His incarnation,
- His full humanity,
- · His voluntary death on the cross, and
- · His eternal reign as Lord over all.

The Pre-existence of Christ


- He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through Him, and apart from Him nothing came into being that has come into being (John 1:2-3).
- No one has ascended into heaven, but He who descended from heaven: the Son of Man (John 3:13).
- Jesus said, "You are from below, I am from above; you are of this world, I am not of this world (John 8:23)

The Incarnation

- In His descent from His majestic position in eternity past, Jesus was made in the likeness of men through a miraculous conception and a virgin birth.
- Not only did the Holy Spirit supernaturally bring about the immaculate conception within the virgin Mary, even more remarkable, He united the divine nature with the human nature in Christ.
- Jesus emptied Himself by refusing to cling to His advantages, privileges, and prerogatives as God.


Two Natures in Christ

- Jesus "had to be made like His brethren in all things, so that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining and to make propitiation for the sins of the people 2 17).
- The uncreated, infinite and eternal nature of God was fully integrated with the created, finite nature of man.
 - The eternal glory of the Son of God was concealed by the perishable flesh of man.



The Lowest Point of His Descent

- The perfect and sinless Son of Man became sin for His people (2 Cor. 5:21).
- As He was being immersed in the wrath of a sin-avenging God, He cried out, "My God, My God, why have you forsaken Me?" (Mat. 27:46).




"It Is Finished" Speaks Volumes


Blood Was Shed

- The bloody animal sacrifices of the OT foreshadowed the Savior's blood being poured out for the forgiveness of sin (Matt. 26:28).


Redemption was Paid

What was the price? "You were not redeemed with perishable things like silver or gold...but with precious blood...the blood of Christ" (1 Pet. 1:18-19).








Salvation Was Secured

- Forty days after His resurrection, Jesus ascended into heavenly glory. He parted from His disciples and was carried up into heaven. And after worshiping Him, they returned to Jerusalem with great joy (Luke 24:51-52).
- The suffering Servant was lifted up to be the sovereign Shepherd of His sheep and an advocate of the Father who pleads our case (1 John 2:1).

- After His perfect obedience to His Father's will, the Lord Jesus returned to the glory He had with the Father before the world was made (John 17:5).

- Only omnipotent, omniscient One who overcame for all the offenses of outcasts


- Perfect and pure Prince of Peace and Prophet, pierced and persecuted to pardon prodigals, prisoners and prostitutes
