

Application

- As believers, we are to take God at his word and step up to the responsibilities of obeying him and not be continually relying on someone else to always remind us or be leading us – the Word was written for the common person, not just leaders
 - Ex. Believe unto the end, serve, be faithful, be obedient, be a "one another" type believer in the church
- When we do fail to obey, be quick to take responsibility, confess, repent, and get back to being obedient
- As brothers and sisters in Christ, be willing to confront others to be obedient
