



- S Formed a triad of cities with Laeodicea (10 miles W) and Hierapolis (13 miles NW)

- **Solution** During the Persian and Greek empires

 - Important center of the wool industry, sheep grazed on nearby fertile pasture lands, and dyes were made from nearby chalk deposits
- © During the Roman empire
 - Road to Pergamos was rerouted through Laodicea, bypassing Colossae



- Laeodicea and Hierapolis both mentioned as having communities of believers

Colossians 4:13 For I testify for him that he has a deep concern for you and for those who are in Laodicea and Hierapolis.



Acts 19:10 This took place for two years, so that all who lived in Asia heard the word of the Lord, both Jews and Greeks.



- Church not founded by Paul

Colossians 2:1 For I want you to know how great a struggle I have on your behalf and for those who are at Laodicea, and for all those who have not personally seen my face



- Laeodicea and Hierapolis both mentioned as having communities of believers
- Church not founded by Paul
- Church founded by Epaphras (native of Colossae)

 - Style different from Paul's other writings

- Support from Philemon
 - ⊠ Both Colossians and Philemon:
 - Sent to the same town
 - Include the names of Paul, Timothy, Onesimus, Epaphras, Mark, Aristarchus, Demas, and Luke
 - Contain a message to Archippus
 - Raul's authorship of Philemon is not questioned

The Place Colossians 4:10–14 Aristarchus, my fellow prisoner, sends you his greetings; and also Barnabas's cousin Mark (about whom you received instructions; if he comes to you, welcome him); and also Jesus who is called Justus; these are the only fellow workers for the kingdom of God who are from the circumcision, and they have proved to be an encouragement to me. Epaphras, who is one of your number, a bondslave of Jesus Christ, sends you his greetings, always laboring earnestly for you in his prayers, that you may stand perfect and fully assured in all the will of God. For I testify for him that he has a deep concern for you and for those who are in Laodicea and Hierapolis. Luke, the beloved physician, sends you his greetings, and also Demas.

 - Unlikely so small a city as Caesarea would have been the hub for the kinds of missionary activities mentioned in Colossians
 - ☐ If here, Paul would have made some mention of Philip, with whom Paul stayed shortly before his arrest

Acts 21:8 On the next day we left and came to Caesarea, and entering the house of Philip the evangelist, who was one of the seven, we stayed with him.

 - There is no clear evidence that Paul was ever imprisoned there
 - Calculate Was with Paul when Colossians was written but not with Paul during his ministry in Ephesus



 - Colossians 2:20–23 ²⁰If you have died with Christ to the elementary principles of the world, why, as if you were living in the world, do you
 - submit yourself to decrees, such as, ²¹"Do not handle, do not taste, do not touch!"... in accordance with the commandments and teachings of
 - men? ²³These are matters which have, to be sure, the appearance of wisdom in self-made religion and self-abasement and severe treatment of the body, but are of no value against fleshly indulgence.

- 1. To express his personal interest in the church
- 2. To warn them against reverting to their old pagan vices
- 3. To refute the false teaching that was threatening the Colossian church*

The all-sufficiency of Christ

Christ is God's Son
Christ is the object of the Christian's faith
Christ is Redeemer
Christ is the Image of God
Christ is Lord of creation
Christ is the Head of the church
Christ is Reconciler of the universe
In Christ dwells the fullness of the Godhead
Christ is Head over every power and
authority in the universe
Christ is the essence of the mystery of God

In Christ are hidden all God's treasures and of wisdom and knowledge
Christ is the standard by which all religious teaching is to be measured
