

- - Christian wives, be subject to your husband (also Eph 5:22, Titus 2:5, 1 Peter 3:1)
- The *correct meaning* of submission
 - The wife is to acknowledge the rightful authority of her husband in their marriage
 - The wife is to voluntarily order, or rank herself, under her husband's authority

- The *wrong meaning* of submission
 - It does not mean that a wife should tolerate physical abuse in submission to her husband
 - It does not mean that a wife should allow her husband to cause her to sin
 - It does not mean that a wife should never confront her husband about a pattern of unrepentant sin

- Some *wrong* and/or *sinful responses* regarding submission
 - Paul is expressing personal prejudice, so this doesn't apply today
 - This command reflects first century culture and doesn't apply today
 - Submission and headship leads to abuses and therefore must be wrong
 - My husband isn't a believer so this doesn't apply
 - God and the Bible must view men as superior and women as inferior
 - I reject submission and will continue to battle for headship in my marriage and home
 - Submission means I can never give counsel or share concerns with my husband

- ™ The *reasons* for submission
 - Because it reflects the character of Christ
 - 🗷 Because submission to a rightful authority is a noble, biblical virtue
 - 🗷 Because God has created order into the very fabric of the moral universe
 - **©** Because God placed the husband as the head of the wife
 - cs ...others
- The *proper attitudes* of submission
 - It is to be done as part of submission to, and love of, Christ
 - It is not merely to be done externally, but from the heart

Christian husbands, love your wife



- - Christian husbands, love your wife
 - Christian husbands, don't be embittered toward your wife
- The *correct meaning* of loving your wife
 - The husband is to love his wife according to the pattern of Christ (Eph 5:25)
 - Loving based on a decision of the will rather than feelings
 - Loving not based on merit but given even when undeserved
 - Loving sacrificially
 - The husband is to love his wife as he loves his own body (Eph 5:28-30)

- Some wrong and/or sinful responses regarding loving your wife
 - You just don't know my wife
 - I don't need to love my wife because she doesn't love or respect me
 - Socusing on the authority given in headship but not the responsibility to love
 - Having shown love in the past counts for loving her in the present

- The *reasons* for loving your wife
 - Because it reflects the character of Christ
 - **©** Because the responsibility of loving comes with biblical headship
 - **Because** it sanctifies her (Eph 5:26-27)
- The *proper attitudes* in loving your wife
 - CS Pursue sanctification for yourself
 - Os Do nothing that would expose her to sin and temptation
 - **3** Be the spiritual leader of your home
 - 🗠 Put your wife's interests, desires, and needs before your own
