








The Life of David











Theme: God continues to accomplish His sovereign plans in establishing the throne and city of David as key elements in redemptive history

- David is anointed king over all Israel (vv1-5)
 - The tribes of Israel acknowledge that David should be king (vv1-2)
 Why?
 - God had blessed David with great military successes when he served Saul (v2a)
 - God had revealed that David was destined to become Israel's king (v2b)
 - 3. Abner, the military leader under Saul, had endorsed David (2 Sam 3)
 - 4. David's respectful treatment of the leaders from Saul's dynasty (2 Sam 4)

Deuteronomy 17:14–17 ¹⁴When you enter the land which the LORD your God gives you, and you possess it and live in it, and you say, 'I will set a king over me like all the nations who are around me,' 15 you shall surely set a king over you whom the LORD your God chooses, one from among your countrymen you shall set as king over yourselves; you may not put a foreigner over yourselves who is not your countryman. ¹⁶Moreover, he shall not multiply horses for himself, nor shall he cause the people to return to Egypt to multiply horses, since the LORD has said to you, 'You shall never again return that way.' 17He shall not multiply wives for himself, or else his heart will turn away; nor shall he greatly increase silver and gold for himself.
