

"Darius"

- 1. Darius the Mede is literary fiction.
- 2. Darius is Gubaru (Gobryas), the governor of Babylon (mentioned in the Nabonidus Chronicle and other ancient texts)
 - Cyrus appointed him as governor of Babylon after the city was taken.
 - Gubaru installed sub-governors in Babylon (cf. 6:1-2).
 - The phrase in 5:31 "received the kingdom" may mean from a superior.
 - The expression in 9:1 that Darius was "made ruler" may mean by a superior.
 - Darius could have legitimately been called "king," if he oversaw all the previous Babylonian empire under Cyrus.
 - 5:31 says Darius was 62, and Gubaru is called "a man well advanced in years."

- 3. Darius is actually a title for Cyrus, the first ruler of the Medo-Persian Empire.
 - It was not uncommon for rulers to have dual titles.
 - Dual titles fit the book of Daniel.
 - Written in two languages; Daniel and his friends all had two names.
 - Cyrus would have been about 62.
 - Cyrus stayed in Babylon during the winter.
 - 6:28 can be translated: "Daniel enjoyed success in the reign of Darius, <u>even</u> in the reign of Cyrus the Persian."
 - In 11:1, two ancient Jewish sources, the LXX and Theodotion, replace *Darius* in the Hebrew text with the name *Cyrus*.


