





 Route of Joab and his commanders from Jerusalem throughout Israel to take a census

### David's Sin

- The trigger and decision to number the people (24:1-2)
- The objection from Joab and the commanders of the army (vv3-4a)
- The census of 9 months and 20 days (vv4b-8)
- The final report of 800k fighting men in Israel and 500k in Judah (v9)

1 Chronicles 21:5 <sup>5</sup>Joab gave the number of the census of *all* the people to David. And all Israel were 1,100,000 men who drew the sword; and Judah *was* 470,000 men who drew the sword.

#### David's Confession and Dilemma

The troubled heart and acknowledgment of sin (v10)

Exodus 30:12–14 <sup>12</sup>"When you take a census of the sons of Israel to number them, then each one of them shall give a ransom for himself to the LORD, when you number them, so that there will be no plague among them when you number them. <sup>13</sup>"This is what everyone who is numbered shall give: half a shekel according to the shekel of the sanctuary (the shekel is twenty gerahs), half a shekel as a contribution to the LORD. <sup>14</sup>"Everyone who is numbered, from twenty years old and over, shall give the contribution to the LORD.

#### David's Confession and Dilemma

- The troubled heart and acknowledgment of sin (v10)
- The 3 options of judgment given by God (vv11-13)

1 Chronicles 21:12 <sup>12</sup>either three years of famine, or three months to be swept away before your foes, while the sword of your enemies overtakes *you*, or else three days of the sword of the LORD, even pestilence in the land, and the angel of the LORD destroying throughout all the territory of Israel.' Now, therefore, consider what answer I shall return to Him who sent me."

#### David's Confession and Dilemma

- The troubled heart and acknowledgment of sin (v10)
- The 3 options of judgment given by God (vv11-13)

```
Option #1 - 3 years of famine in the land
```

Option #2 - 3 months of running from your enemies

Option #3 - 3 days of pestilence in the land

- The choice of option #3, where many men are killed (vv14-15)
- The mercy of God and plea of David (vv16-17)


1 Samuel 15:29 <sup>29</sup> "Also the Glory of Israel will not lie or change His mind; for He is not a man that He should change His mind."

2 Chronicles 3:1 <sup>1</sup>Then Solomon began to build the house of the LORD in Jerusalem on Mount Moriah, where the *LORD* had appeared to his father David, at the place that David had prepared on the threshing floor of Ornan the Jebusite.
