Romans 11:33-36

I. The Gospel Displays the Glory of God (33-35)

A. God's Inexhaustible Attributes (33a)

1. Mercy
2. Wisdom

The depth of God's wisdom displayed in...

1. The eternal plan of redemption (1:2; 3:21; 4:1ff; 16:25)
2. The person of Jesus Christ—the God-Man—as our savior (1:2-4)
3. The saving power of the gospel (1:16-17)
4. The means of justification by faith alone (3:21-24)
5. The purpose of the cross in satisfying the justice of God (3:25-26)
6. The appointment of Adam & Christ as our legal representatives (5:12ff)

The depth of God's wisdom displayed in...

7. The security of the justified believer because of regeneration and the indwelling Spirit (5-8)
8. The unconditional election of undeserving sinners (9-11)
9. The choice of preaching as the method of announcing that message (Rom. 10:14-15)
10. The historical plan for the Jews and the Gentiles (11)

1. Mercy

1. Exclamation – “*Oh!*” (33a)
2. Meditation – 33-36 is a poem in Greek
3. Adoration – 33-36 is a doxology in response to 11 chapters of theology!
