

Section I - Jesus Publicly confronts the false Jewish leaders (10-17)

- A. The occasion (10) Jesus teaching in the synagogue
- B. A merciful healing (11-13)
- C. The lecture to the crowd by the synagogue official (14)
- D. Jesus's response (15-16)
 - •If you can release a barn animal tied up for a few hours on the Sabbath, then why not release a daughter of Abraham from her 18 year bondage on the Sabbath?
- E. The Result (17)
 - The Pharisees humiliated
 - The crowd glorified God

Section I - Jesus Publicly confronts the false Jewish leaders (10-17)

- F. False narratives about Jesus:
 - Jesus casted out demons by the power of the devil (Matt 9:34, Matt 12:24, Mark 3:22, Luke 11:15).
 - Jesus was a glutton and a drunkard (Matt 11:19, Luke 7:34).
 - Jesus improperly associated with sinners (Luke 5:30, Luke 15:2, Luke 19:7, Matt 9:11)
 - Jesus violated the 4th commandment by not properly keeping the Sabbath (Matt 12:2, Matt 12:10, John 7:23, John 9:16, Luke 14:3)

Section 2 - The growth and influence of Jesus's spiritual Kingdom (18-21)

- A. "So" connects to the previous section
- B. Comparison Illustrations The kingdom of God is like . . .
- C. Illustration I A mustard seed which becomes a large plant
 - Christ's Kingdom will start small but grow large and significant
 - People from all ethnicities, families, nationalities will partake.
- D. Illustration 2 Leaven and flour
 - Christ's spiritual kingdom will grow in its influence until it permeates all nations.
 - Note: this growth is subtle and accomplished through ordinary means.
