
Perspective, Preaching and Payment

Introduction

• Theme: Our perspective should account for God to be at work, and we should acknowledge that we need to be at work for Him.

A. Context

- 1. Jesus is in his final hours
- 2. He has been hailed by the people (Luke 19:38)
- 3. He has been rebuked by the Pharisees (Luke 19:39)
- 4. The Jewish leaders are trying to "destroy him" (Luke 19:47)

1. Perspective determines if we Preach or Pass (v. 1-8)

A. Christ's Activity in the Temple

- 1. Jesus can count his remaining time in hours
- 2. He spends it Preaching His Own Gospel!

B. Jewish Leaders' Activity in the Temple

- 1. They "confront" Jesus this is an attack
- 2. They question his earthly credentials
- 3. Why? They have a SELF-FOCUSED perspective

1. Perspective determines if we Preach or Pass (v. 1-8)

- C. Christ's answer a Counter-Question
 - 1. "What do you think about the SOURCE of authority?"
 - 2. Jewish Leaders' response or refusal to respond!
 - 3. Their non-answer meant they weren't looking for an answer to their own question

Application:

- 1. Are we allowing for God's Plans and Actions when we act?
- 2. We are commanded to Preach the Gospel, but not to Fight about it

II. A Parable of Perspective and Payment (v. 9-18)

A. The Characters

- 1. Vineyard Owner = God the Father
- 2. Vine-growers / Tenant Farmers = Jewish Leaders (Vines = God's People)
- 3. Slaves / Messengers = Prophets and Judges
- 4. Son = God the Son

B. Their Character

- 1. Vine-growers focused on their own situation, and how to better it
- 2. Vineyard Owner focused on the welfare of the Vine-growers and the vineyard!
- 3. The Son like his Father, focused on the good of the people

II. A Parable of Perspective and Payment (v. 9-18)

C. The Point

- 1. Jesus asks what the natural outcome of a situation like this is:
 - a) The Vine-growers will be judged and destroyed
 - b) The vineyard will be given to others
- 2. The Vine-growers' self-interest and violence repulse the people. "May it never be!"
 - a) But Jesus explains this is exactly what's happening in Israel!
- 3. The Vineyard Owner expected payment. It was his right, and He would find people who would work to produce His fruit

Application

- 1. Perspective: when we reject God's part in the story, we invite Judgement
- 2. Payment: God Deserves and Expects our Fruit as believers! We are to be at Work!

III. A Perspective on Ownership (v. 19-26)

- A. The Jewish Leaders are operating on Fear
 - 1. The fear both Jesus and the People
 - 2. They want to get him in trouble with the Romans
- B. Jesus is focused on Ownership and Authority
 - 1. He explains Caesar's right to the Denarius

 - 2. He explains the Father's right to that which bears His image: YOU!

Application: Your life bears God's Image and Inscription, and He wants to use it for His Glory!
