THE PASSION WEEK

Day of the week	Key Events
Prior to the week	Jewish leaders determined to kill Jesus (John 11:47-53) Question of the crowds – would Jesus come to the feast? (John 11:55-56)
Friday	Jesus arrived in Bethany and stayed at the home of Mary, Martha, and Lazarus (John 12:1)
Saturday Evening	Jesus attended a feast at the home of Simon the Leper. This is where Mary (Martha's sister) anointed him with the precious perfume. Judas became indignant, and Jesus rebuked Judas. (Matt 26:6-13, John 12:1-8)
Sunday	The Triumphal entry (Luke 19:28-40) Afternoon – goes to the temple, looks around, and then leaves back to Bethany (Mark 11:11)
Monday	Cleansing the Temple (Luke 19:45-48) Teaching in the Temple (Luke 20:1ff) Beginning of debates with the Jewish Leaders (Luke 20:1ff)
Tuesday	Teaching in the Temple (Luke 20:1ff) Main Debates with the Jewish Leaders & condemnation and woes against the Pharisees (Luke 20:1-21:4) Olivet Discourse - primarily Eschatology (Luke 21:5-38)
Wednesday	Silent day – possibly when Judas made his bargain to betray Jesus (Luke 22:1-6)
Thursday	Last Supper, teaching the disciples, prayer in the garden, arrest, Jewish trials (Luke 22:7-65)
Friday	Trials, crucifixion, death, and burial (Luke 22:66-23:56)

 - I. The Bread symbolizes Christ's body as a sacrificial substitute for sins (Heb 10:10, I Pet 2:24, Isa 53:11, 2 Cor 5:21)
 - 2. The Cup symbolizes the New Covenant Forgiveness, spiritual cleansing, a regenerated heart, the Holy Spirit (Jer 31:31-34, Ezek 36:24-29)
