### VI. The Biblical Correction: What Is the Truth?

#### A. The Biblical Truth about Sex & Gender

1. God created human beings in His own image (Gen. 1:26-27; 5:1).
2. God created humanity in two genders, equal as persons but distinct as male and female (Gen. 1:26-27; 5:2; Mt.19:3-6).
3. God designed the differences between the two sexes for human good and flourishing (Gen. 1:31; 2:18).
4. In eternity past, God sovereignly determined every person's biological sex and at conception assigns the corresponding chromosomes and reproductive structures (Gen. 1:27; 18:10).
5. God intended every person's biological sex to dictate their self-conception as male or female (Gen. 2:21-25).
6. God sovereignly determined that *you* would be male or female (Ps. 139:13-16).

# The Gender Question (Pt. 3)

## *Selected Scripture*

### B. The Biblical Truth about Men's & Women's Roles

1. As Creator, God alone has the right and the wisdom to define the nature of manhood & womanhood and has done so in His Word (Gen. 1:26-27; 5:2).
2. Satan and our flesh tempt us to reject God's design and to pursue a different standard for men's and women's roles (Gen. 3:6, 16).
3. Every Christian must reject all unbiblical definitions of manhood and womanhood and pursue God's revealed standard alone.
  - a. God has established two common priorities for every man and woman (Mt. 22:34-40).
  - b. God has set one common goal for the character of every Christian man and woman: to be like Jesus Christ (Rom. 8:29).
  - c. God has also established specific character qualities and priorities for men and women (Pr. 31; 1 Tim. 2:9-15; 3:1-7; Titus 2; 1 Pet. 3:1-6).
  - d. God designed most men and women to be married but has specifically gifted some for singleness (Gen. 2:18, 24; 1 Cor. 7:1-6, 7, 32-35).
  - e. God designed that most married men and women will have children (Gen. 1:28; 4:1; Mal. 2:14-15; Titus 2:4-5a).

# The Gender Question (Pt. 3)

## *Selected Scripture*

f. God designed men and women for unique roles.

❖ In Marriage and Family

- Men were made to lead in their marriages and homes by serving their wives and families in a gracious, sacrificial way, shepherding them toward the Lord (Eph. 5:23, 25; 6:4; Mk. 10:42-45).
- Wives were made to be helpers, life-givers, and nurturers, submitting to their husband's leadership (Gen. 2:18; 1 Cor. 11:11-12; Eph. 5:22; Col. 3:18; 1 Pet. 3:1-6).

❖ In the Church (1 Tim. 2:9-15; 3:1-7; Titus 2:3-5)

- God has determined that men He has gifted and qualified are to lead in the church by serving as elders (1 Tim. 2:9-15; 3:1-7).
- Other men and women are to use their spiritual gifts to serve in every other ministry (Rom. 12:3-8).
