



Proposition:

Question: How does our Lord Jesus Christ expect believers to conduct themselves while serving in the church?

Answer: Our Lord provides a "How-To-Guide" of how a church should grow and excel following His written Word. Believers are instructed in how to live obediently before their spiritual leaders, before one another, and before their God.

Implication: The success of the believer's growth is ultimately guaranteed by our Lord Jesus Christ who calls us and will bring our sanctification to pass.



"Sanctification is the ongoing spiritual refining of the soul. Looking at it negatively, it is getting rid of something. In the positive, it is bringing something in, the spiritual refinement of the soul. This the New Testament calls 'the renewing of the mind.' The purging part is cleansing ourselves of sin. On the one hand we are purging out the sin, on the other we're renewing the mind. Paul used these terms, 'Putting on the Lord Jesus Christ.' Sanctification is that two-fold process by which we're purging out sin in the power of God, and by which we are implanting spiritual refinement through the power of God."

"Moreover, sanctification lies chiefly in the heart. It is the inner person. It is the adorning, as 1 Peter 3 says, of the 'hidden man of the heart.' It is an inward grace, it is not an outward show. It ultimately shows up on the outside, but in and of itself it is an inward grace."


V. How to Pray for your Spiritual Servant Leaders 5:25



This is the first time in the letter that the greeting brothers (used 15 times in 1 Thes.; see comments on 1:4) occurs at the beginning of a sentence in the original. It is emphatic in this position. The force of the present tense here is a strong "keep on praying." Paul's appeal for prayer was to those he regarded as his brothers. Doubtless much of the success of his missionary work could be attributed to the prayers of the Thessalonians and other believers. Paul understood both his personal insufficiency and God's sufficiency (cf. 2 Cor. 3:5). He requested prayer for his fellow workers as well as for himself.

- 1. Value your servant leaders (elders) who work hard to provide you the nourishment necessary for spiritual growth.
 - o You determine how you can best value the servant leaders who are vested in your loves.

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- 2. Pray for your elders as they work hard to serve you and provide what's needed for your spiritual growth in Christ. Categories include:
 - o Purity
 - o Passion
 - o Time Management and Consistency in life
 - o Ongoing family relationships
 - o Spiritual return on teaching ministry
 - o Accuracy and clarity in preaching/teaching
 - o Overall spiritual effectiveness and God's blessing in ministry

- 3. Prepare to Benefit from the Preaching/Teaching Ministry of those who serve you.
 - o Preparations and plans you make before Sunday morning
 - o Praying for messages presented and their application in your life
 - o Coming ready to learn and apply messages
 - o Re-listening to missed messages

- 4. Taking an active role in mentoring others in the body life of our local church.
 - o Lovingly warn those who are immature and close to disappearing
 - o Consoling those who are sometimes discouraged
 - o Investing in the discipleship of those who are less mature

- 5. Personal Spiritual Habits and dispositions grown in God's Spirit.
 - o Joyful
 - o Reading, Studying, and Meditating in the Word
 - o Praying
 - o Thankful
 - o Spirit Controlled (Obedient to the Word)
 - o Discerning
 - o Clinging to Good
 - o Shunning all forms of Evil
