Bible Knowledge Commentary

The short Book of Obadiah presents a powerful message. It shows what happens to those who reject God's Word and His grace, rebelling in foolish pride.

During Edom's prosperity many in Israel could have asked, "Why do the wicked prosper?" But the voice of Obadiah comes thundering through the pages of the Old Testament and is echoed in the New: "Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows" (Gal 6:7) Obadiah's words underscore the fact of God's justice. "For we know Him who said, It is Mine to avenge; I will repay. '... It is a dreadful thing to fall into the hands of the living God" (Heb 10:30–31).

One who responds in obedience to the grace of God has everything to gain, but a person who spurns His grace in pride has everything to lose.
