1. The Meaning of Maturity

- 1. Holokleros (ὁλόκληρος) Meets expectations, Intact and Blameless.
- 2. Teleios (τέλειος) Attaining an end or a purpose, Finished, Complete.

"A mature person is one who is fully taught. He or she is one who knows God's will in and through his word and is fully committed to following it. A mature person is so ingrained and grounded in the truth of God's word that he is she is not easily swayed by false doctrines."



2. The Motives for Maturity

- 1. So that we are **Obedient** to God's word (1 Cor. 14:20,13:11;Eph. 4:14-15; Heb. 5:12-13)
- 2. So that our lives would Reflect Christ (Rom. 8:29-30; 2 Cor. 3:18; Rom. 13:14; 1Cor. 11:1)
- 3. So that we would be **Equipped** for every good work (2 Tim. 3:14-17)

- 4. So that we would be in the best position to **Disciple** others (1 Tim. 3:6)
- 5. So that we would make God's Goal for us, our own (1 Cor. 14:20; Col. 4:12)

Why Does God Permit Trials?

- Trials are a part of God's work in the life of a believer (Rom. 8:28)
- Trials proves God's Power (Judges 7:2)
- Trials prepares us to serve God (Romans 5:3-5)
- Trials produce spiritual maturity (James 1:3-4)
- Trials pushes us to depend on God (1 Cor. 1:28-29,31)
- Trials perhaps are a part of God's discipline process (Heb. 12:5-6; Psalm 139:23-24)
- Trials prepare us to serve others (2 Cor. 1:3-4)
