 - The Bible claims to be the very words of God
 - 1900x -'message from God'
 - 3800x 'God said' or 'thus says the Lord'
 - The Process of Inspiration
 - Exodus 4:10-16; 7:1-4
 - Deuteronomy 4:2; 13:1-5; 18:18-22; Jeremiah 1:4-10

The Jewish Canon (Tanach)

- Law (Torah) Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy
- Prophets (Nebiim) Joshua, Judges, Samuel (1/2), Kings (1/2), Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel,
 The Minor Prophets (= one book: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum,
 Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi)
- Writings (Chetuvim) Psalms, Job, Proverbs, Ruth, Song of Solomon, Ecclesiastes,
 Lamentations, Esther, Daniel, Ezra-Nehemiah (= one book), Chronicles (1/2)

 - The 3 part closed canon was assumed by Jesus Luke 11:49-51
