


JESUS'S VIEW OF MARRIAGE



HISTORICAL CONTEXT (10:1)





- A. A controversial question: is divorce allowed under the OT Law? (2)
 - Matt 19:3 Some Pharisees came to Jesus, testing Him and asking, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any reason at all?"
 - Deut 24:1–4--1 "When a man takes a wife and marries her, and it happens that she finds no favor in his eyes because he has found some indecency in her, and he writes her a certificate of divorce and puts it in her hand and sends her out from his house, 2 and she leaves his house and goes and becomes another man's wife, 3 and if the latter husband turns against her and writes her a certificate of divorce and puts it in her hand and sends her out of his house, or if the latter husband dies who took her to be his wife, 4 then her former husband who sent her away is not allowed to take her again to be his wife, since she has been defiled; for that is an abomination before the LORD, and you shall not bring sin on the land which the LORD your God gives you as an inheritance.

- B. Jesus's redirection: What does the law say? (3)
- C. The revealing answer: Moses said we could! (4)
- D. Jesus's public correction: God intends marriage to be permanent! (5-9)

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 - The real reason God permitted divorce: hardness of heart (5)
 - The biblical correction (6-9)
 - God ordained the institution of marriage at Creation (6a)
 - God intended for marriage to be between one man and one woman (6b-8)
 - · Each new marriage establishes a new family unit (7-8)
 - In a marriage, 2 people become united are are viewed by God as a single union (7-8)
 - · God sovereignly acts in each biblical marriage to join the man and woman together (9a)
 - · Because each marriage is sovereignly ordained, it is intended by God to be permanent (9b).

- D. Jesus's public correction: God intends marriage to be permanent! (5-9)
 - · The real reason God permitted divorce: hardness of heart (5)
 - The biblical correction (6-9)
 - The only 2 exceptions
 - Exception 1: Adultery (Matt 19:9)
 - Exception 2: Abandonment by an unbelieving spouse (1 Cor 7)

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- E. Jesus's private reiteration: Divorce without Biblically permitted grounds is adultery (10-12)

LESSONS/CONSIDERATIONS

- God bringing two people together in marriage is much higher than an earthly legal contract. It is a divine transaction and a permanently sealed binding declaration.
- For those of you who are married:
 - God, who does not make mistakes, has sovereignly ordained your marriage. He brought you and your spouse together for a divine purpose.
 - Be thankful for your spouse.
 - · Be faithful to your spouse in every area and in every way both mentally and physically.
 - · Be faithful to submit to God's divinely ordained roles in your marriage.
 - God hates divorce. Therefore, divorce must not be a part of your vocabulary or thinking.

LESSONS/CONSIDERATIONS

- C. For those of you who aren't married:
 - Do not enter into marriage lightly or flippantly.
 - Do not engage in activities that God has specifically designed and intended for marriage. Learn to exercise self-control now.
 - Study and carefully learn God's design for marriage and then pray that God would open your eyes in His perfect timing to His right person for you.
 - Pray that God would prepare you now to become the kind of husband or wife that brings honor and glory to Him.
- D. For those of you who have experienced divorce or possibly even initiated an unbiblical divorce in the past.
 - Help to properly navigate these complicated situations is available!
 - It is not too late!
