- ▶ Your worship is contagious to your children
- ▶ Your marriage preaches the gospel to your children

V. Prioritize Scripture in Instructing your Children

- ▶ Because Scripture gives wisdom for salvation
- ▶ Because Scripture is profitable for:
 - ▶ Teaching
 - ▶ Reproof
 - ▶ Correction
 - ▶ Training in righteousness

V. Prioritize Scripture in Instructing your Children

- ▶ Scripture must be the primary content of our instruction
- ▶ Scripture must fill our minds and hearts as parents
 - ▶ Read Scripture
 - ▶ Study Scripture
 - ▶ Memorize Scripture
 - ▶ Meditate on Scripture

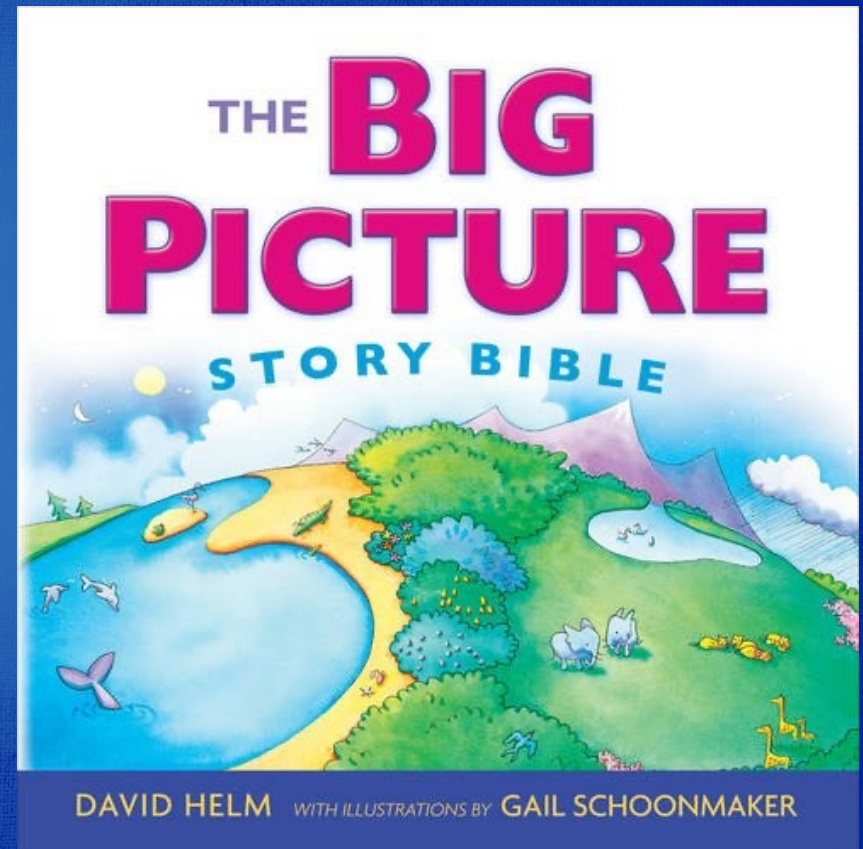

8. Require attention

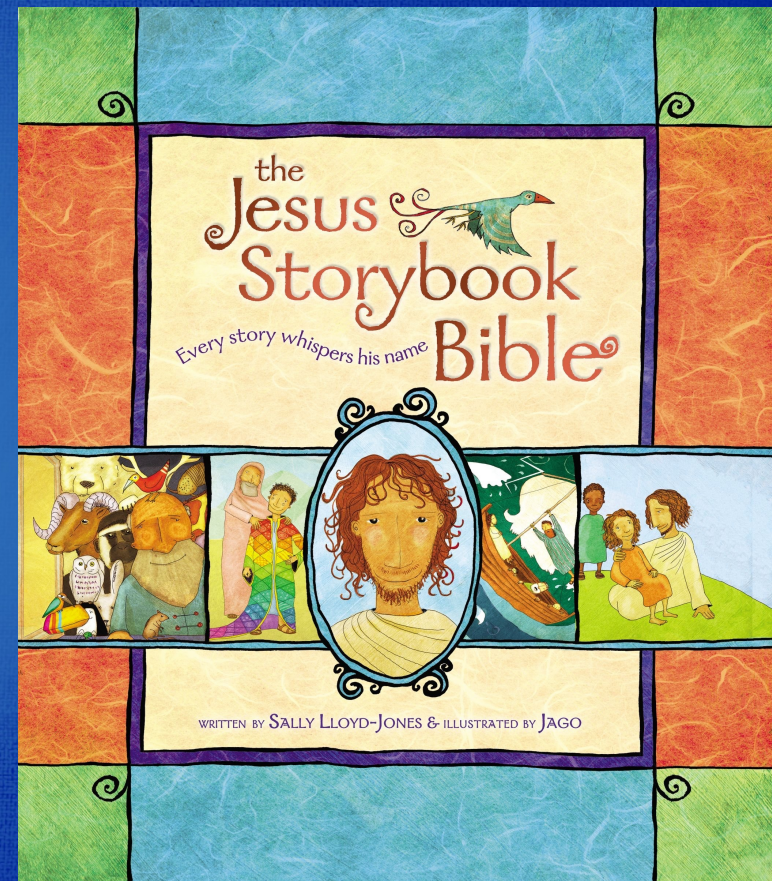

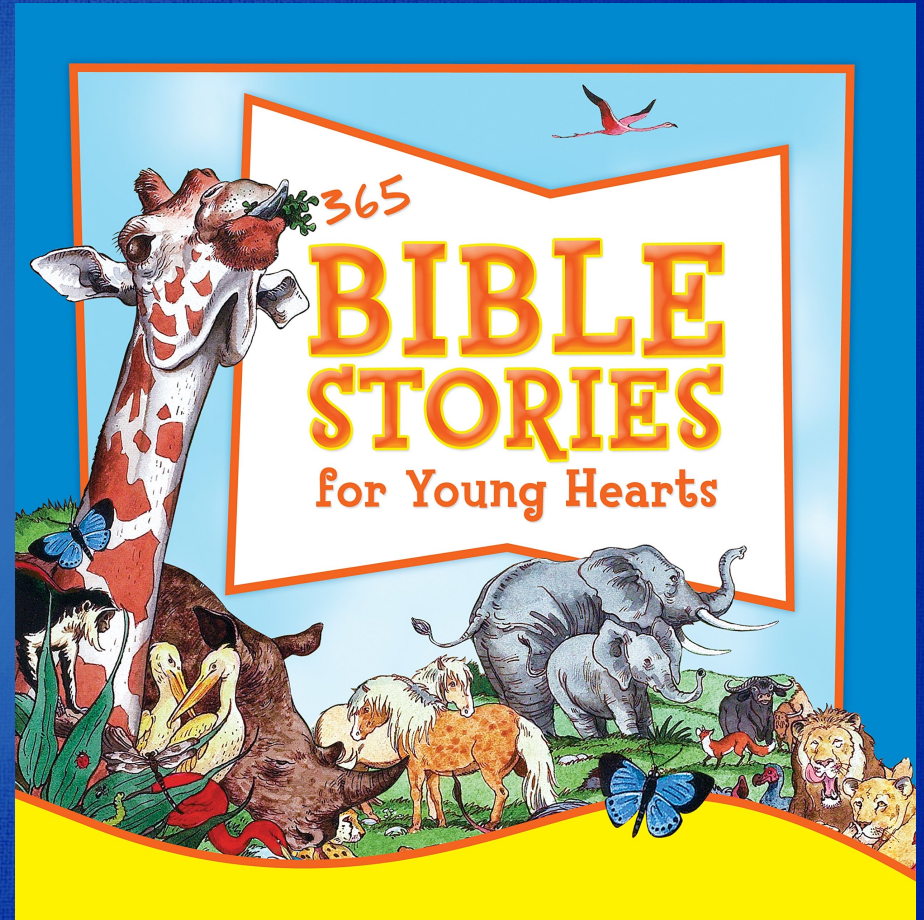

READ

Genesis 1:1-2

EXPLAIN

The truth of Gen 1:1-2

In the beginning, before the creation of the heavens and the earth, there was God. This is because God has always existed. Nobody created God. He is eternal, without a beginning or an end. He existed before creation and everything in creation owes its existence to Him (Col 1:16).

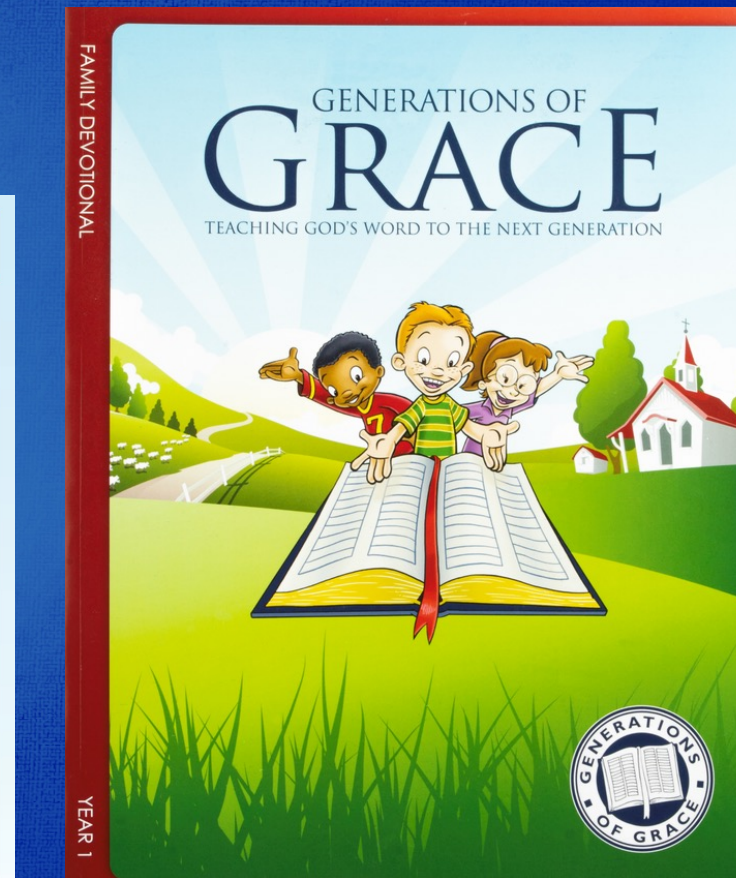
Genesis 1:2 indicates that the earth was empty before God created everything. This was the situation on earth before it was touched by the creative hand of God. Everything that we can see, hear, smell, taste, and touch has been created by God. Even things we can't identify with our senses, things we can't see or touch

ASK

1. What does Genesis 1:1 say that God created?
"God created the heavens and the earth."
2. What existed "in the beginning"?
The Bible says, "In the beginning, God." Before all creation, God existed.
3. If God existed before the creation, where did He come from? When was God created?
No one created God, nor did He just appear. God is eternal, without a beginning or an end.
4. How do we know that God is a powerful God?
His creation.

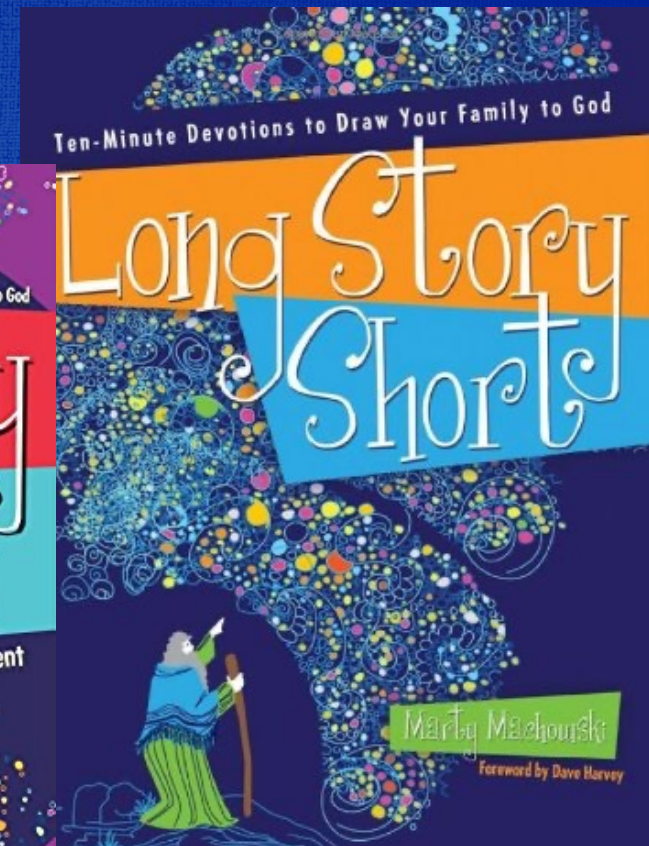
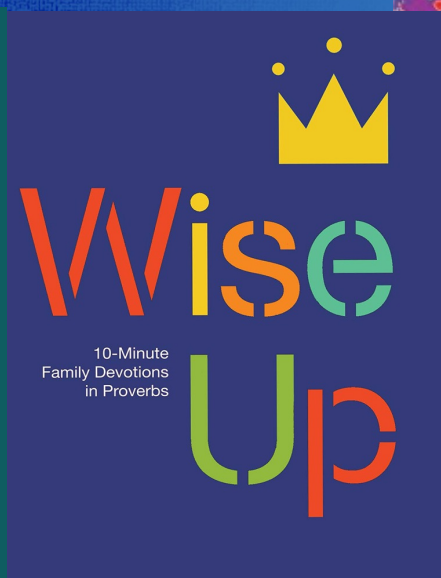
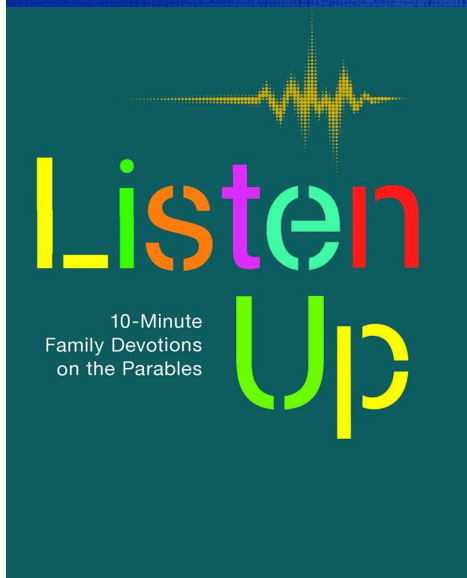
DISCUSS

2. Discuss that God has existed even before the mountains were formed (Ps 90:2).



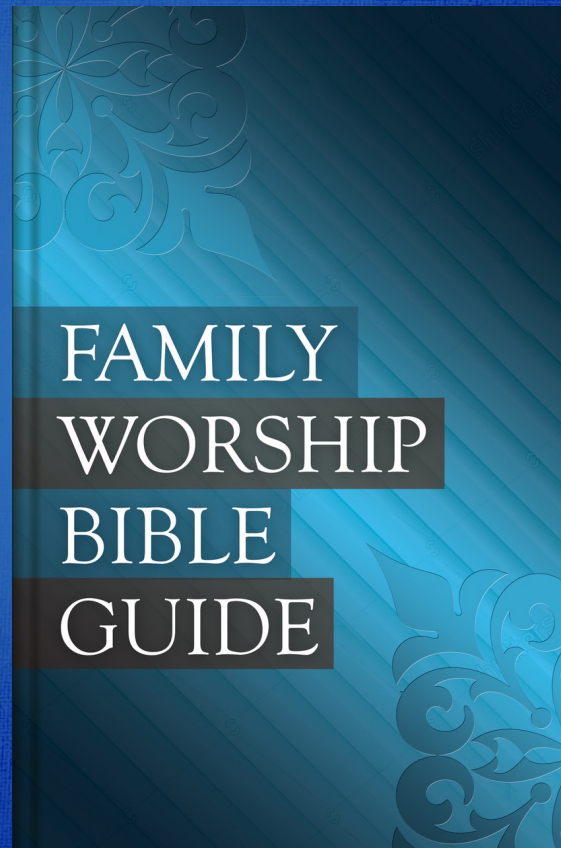

V. Be Intentional in Instructing your Children

“Moses understood that God’s truth cannot effectively be taught if it is confined to the home or classroom. How will our children believe that the Bible is about all of life if we only talk about it during the Bible lesson? ...To put it another way, discipleship is most effectively accomplished when the practice is integrated into the rhythm of everyday life. A consistent time of family worship, for example, is a great discipleship practice, but it is no substitute for a lifestyle of discipleship that encompasses the breakfast table, the car, bedtime, errands, and chores. There is not a single moment in life that cannot be used as an opportunity for instruction”
