


The Gender Cheating Gap is Wider Among Older Adults % who reported having sex with someone other than spouse while married




Note: Based on adults who are either currently married or have been married before. Source: General Social Survey 2010-2016.

4 kinds of people responding to the fear of the Lord.:

- 1) Those who have no fear or the outcome of their sin. (Rom. 3:18; Rev. 16:17-21)
- 2) Those who fear the consequences of their sin, but reject God's redemption. (Rom.13:3-5; Rev 5:15)

- 3) People who care about their sin but who don't have a right relationship with the Lord. (Acts 10:2; 13:6;26)
- 4) People who affectionally fear God because they are redeemed and because they care greatly about minimizing sin in their lives. (Acts 10:35-36; 2 Cor 7:1; Romans 10:9-13)

- 2) Those who fear the consequences of their sin, but reject God's redemption. (Rom.13:3-5; Rev 5:15)



Implications:


- 1) In your life's journey, understand the likelihood of being in this same situation as this naive young man.

- 6) One is not too old to learn these principles and safeguards


Tips for Parents:


- 1) Special value God places on sexuality

- 6) Be proactive about discussing what a future spouse should be like





