Implications

- 1. You were made to worship—and you are worshipping.
- 2. In every generation, the wide gate and broad road that lead to destruction are easier to find and more heavily traveled than the narrow gate and path that lead to heaven and eternal life.
- 3. False religion is generally more powerful, wealthy, and influential than the true church.
- 4. False religion often works with fallen governments to persecute true believers and the true church.
- 5. Jesus Christ is the King of kings and Lord of lords, and He will one day destroy all who have abused His people, dishonored His Father, slandered His name, and rebelled against His rightful authority.
