Six Charges for Covenant Couples

Christian Husbands

- One Woman
 - *"each man is to have his own wife,"* (2a)

Christian Wives

- One Man
 - *"and each woman is to have her own husband."* (2b)

Six Charges for Covenant Couples

Exhortation from God to Remain in Matrimony (10-11)

Christian Husbands

- Do Not Divorce Your Christian Wife
 - *"and that the husband should not divorce his wife"* (11b)

Christian Wives

- Do Not Divorce Your Christian Husband
 - *"that the wife should not leave her husband"* (10b)

Exhortation from God to Remain in Matrimony (10-11)

Christian Husbands

- Do Not Divorce Your Christian Wife
- Do Not Divorce to Remarry Another

Christian Wives

- Do Not Divorce Your Christian Husband
- Do Not Divorce to Remarry Another
 - *"but if she does leave, she must remain unmarried,"* (11a)

Exhortation from God to Remain in Matrimony (10-11)

Christian Husbands

- Do Not Divorce Your Christian Wife
- Do Not Divorce to Remarry Another
- Do Not Divorce, but Reconcile

Christian Wives

- Do Not Divorce Your Christian Husband
- Do Not Divorce to Remarry Another
- Do Not Divorce, but Reconcile
 - *"or else be reconciled to her husband,"* (11b)

Exhortation from Paul to Remain in Matrimony (12-14)

Christian Husbands with Non-Christian Wives

- If Your Unbelieving Wife Chooses to Remain Married, Stay Married.

"if any brother has a wife who is an unbeliever, and she consents to live with him, he must not divorce her." (12)

Christian Wives with Non-Christian Husbands

- If Your Unbelieving Husband Chooses to Remain Married, Stay Married.

"And a woman who has an unbelieving husband, and he consents to live with her, she must not send her husband away." (13)

Exhortation from Paul to Remain in Matrimony (12-14)

Christian Husbands with Non-Christian Wives

- If Your Unbelieving Wife Chooses to Remain Married, Stay Married.
- Consecrate Your Unbelieving Wife

"And the unbelieving wife is sanctified through her believing husband;" (14b)

Christian Wives with Non-Christian Husbands

- If Your Unbelieving Husband Chooses to Remain Married, Stay Married.
- Consecrate Your Unbelieving Husband

"For the unbelieving husband is sanctified through his wife, " (14a)

1. In your season of singleness, purify your heart and renew your mind with the Word of God. (Psa.119:9-11; Rom.12:2)
2. If you have a desire to be married, begin preparing yourself to lead or submit to a godly spouse. (Eph.5:22-33)
3. If you are gifted for singleness, commit yourselves to serving the Lord with your time. (1 Cor.7:32,34b)
4. Christ the Lamb is coming for His Bride the church, make yourselves ready for His return. (Rev.19:6-9)
