Making Choices that Glorify God 1 CORINTHIANS 11:2-16

THEME: For the believer, lifestyle choices ought always to glorify God, being directed by His Word and not by self-centered interests

A Few Questions...

- Is this passage teaching that Christian women should be wearing head coverings whenever they are out in public?
- Or is this passage only dealing with head coverings in the context of corporate worship?
- Is this question of head coverings one that is based on a particular cultural and historical setting valid just for that time, or is it a principle based on God's created order that applies in every time and culture?

- What kind of head covering is Paul referring to when he says women should have their heads covered? A shawl? A veil? Both?
- ▶ What was the normal practice of women in the 1st century and what did it communicate?
- ▶ Did women in the U.S. who commonly wore hats to church prior to about 1960 have the right idea?

Implications & Applications

- There are foundational principles in Scripture that stand unchanged regardless of time and place
- 2. The application of those foundational principles in a particular time and place will vary because the meaning of symbols and expressions change as cultures change
- 3. Our concern must be to make lifestyle choices that are honoring to God and that never stem from a personal agenda focused on ourselves
- 4. In keeping with God's design, we need to maintain any clear cultural distinctions between the genders
- 5. Recognize that if you step outside of a cultural norm, you are communicating a message. Is your message about you? Or is it about the glory of God?
