I. Understand the **Need** for Instructing your Children

► Children are <u>naive</u> and need <u>instruction</u>.

II. Embrace your <u>Responsibility</u> for Instructing your Children

IV. Recognize your **Example** IS Instructing Your Children

- ▶ Your <u>life</u> speaks volumes to your children
- ▶ Your <u>worship</u> is contagious to your children
- ► Your <u>marriage</u> preaches the gospel to your children

V. Prioritize **Scripture** in Instructing your Children

- Because Scripture gives <u>wisdom</u> for salvation
- ▶ Because Scripture is <u>profitable</u> for:
 - ▶ Teaching
 - ▶ Reproof
 - ▶ Correction
 - ► Training in righteousness

V. Prioritize **Scripture** in Instructing your Children

- Scripture must be the primary <u>content</u> of our instruction
- Scripture must fill our <u>minds</u> and <u>hearts</u> as parents
 - Read Scripture
 - Study Scripture
 - ▶ <u>Memorize</u> Scripture
 - ▶ <u>Meditate</u> on Scripture

 *Be careful not to:
 - Coerce a response to the gospel
 - ▶ Improperly assure the child of their salvation



- 4. Make it fun


- 5. Be <u>simple</u> but not <u>shallow</u>

The truth of Gen 1:1-2

In the beginning, before the creation of the heavens and the earth, there was God. This is because God has always existed. Nobody created God. He is eternal, without a beginning or an end. He existed before creation and everything in creation owes its existence to Him (Col 1:16).

Genesis 1:2 indicates that the earth was empty before God created everything. This was the situation on earth before it was touched by the creative hand of God. Everything that we can see, hear, smell, taste, and touch has been created by God. Even things we can't identify




- 1. What does Genesis 1:1 say that God created?
 - "God created the heavens and the earth."
- 2. What existed "in the beginning"? The Bible says, "In the beginning, God." Before all creation, God existed.
- 3. If God existed before the creation, where did He come from? When was God created? No one created God, nor did He just appear. God is eternal, without a beginning or an end.
- 4. How do we know that God is a powerful God? His creation.

How do we target the heart? 5 Questions To Get At Your Child's Heart by Paul Tripp

- 1. What happened?
- 2. What were you thinking and feeling when that happened?
- 3. What did you do in response?
- 4. Why did you do it and what were you <u>seeking</u> to <u>accomplish</u>?
- 5. What was the result?
