

SUMMARY OF JOHN 1:19-37

In this passage, we find one man, the testifier, John the Baptist, giving two testimonies: one about his own ministry and one about the Lord Jesus Christ.

• To give you sufficient evidence from a credible witness that Jesus is the Christ—so that you might believe in Him for eternal life (cf. John 20:30–31).
