1. Statement # 1 – There is One God





Deuteronomy 6:4 - 4"Hear, O Israel! The LORD is our God, the LORD is one!

Exodus 15:11 - ¹¹"Who is like You among the gods, O LORD? Who is like You, majestic in holiness, Awesome in praises, working wonders? (Answer – No one)

1 Kings 8:60 - ⁶⁰so that all the peoples of the earth may know that the LORD is God; there is no one else.

Isaiah 45:5–6 - 5"I am the LORD, and there is no other; Besides Me there is no God. I will gird you, though you have not known Me;

⁶That men may know from the rising to the setting of the sun That there is no one besides Me. I am the LORD, and there is no other,

- **1 Timothy 2:5** ⁵For there is one God, and one mediator also between God and men, the man Christ Jesus,
- **1 Corinthians 8:6 -** ⁶yet for us there is but one God, the Father, from whom are all things and we exist for Him; and one Lord, Jesus Christ, by whom are all things, and we exist through Him.

John 1:1–2 ¹In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was in the beginning with God.

1 John 2:1 ¹My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. And if anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous;

It is clear that the Father is a person and the son is a person, but is the Holy Spirit a person too?

John 14:26 ²⁶ But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you.

"Moreover, the names helper, counselor or *comforter* (Gk. παράκλητος, G4156) is a term commonly used to speak of a person who helps or gives comfort or counsel to another person or persons, but is used of the Holy Spirit in John's gospel (14:16, 26; 15:26; 16:7)."

a. God the Father is God

Genesis 1:1 ¹In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Matthew 6:26–30 ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air, that they do not sow, nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not worth much more than they?

²⁷"And who of you by being worried can add a single hour to his life?

²⁸ And why are you worried about clothing? Observe how the lilies of the field grow; they do not toil nor do they spin,

²⁹yet I say to you that not even Solomon in all his glory clothed himself like one of these.

³⁰"But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the furnace, will He not much more clothe you? You of little faith!

b. God the Son is God

Isaiah 9:6 ⁶For a child will be born to us, a son will be given to us; And the government will rest on His shoulders; And His name will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Eternal Father, Prince of Peace.

Hebrews 1:1–3 ¹God, after He spoke long ago to the fathers in the prophets in many portions and in many ways, ²in these last days has spoken to us in His Son, whom He appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the world. ³And He is the radiance of His glory and the exact representation of His nature, and upholds all things by the word of His power. When He had made purification of sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high,

Hebrews 1:8 ⁸But of the Son He says, "Your throne, O God, is forever and ever, And the righteous scepter is the scepter of His kingdom.

b. God the Son is God

Luke 15:10 ¹⁰"In the same way, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

Matthew 13:41 ⁴¹ The Son of Man will send forth His angels, and they will gather out of His kingdom all stumbling blocks, and those who commit lawlessness,

b. God the Son is God

Matthew 25:31 ³¹ But when the Son of Man comes in His glory, and all the angels with Him, then He will sit on His glorious throne.

Matthew 24:30 ³⁰ And then the sign of the Son of Man will appear in the sky, and then all the tribes of the earth will mourn, and they will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of the sky with power and great glory.

c. God the Spirit is God

1 Corinthians 3:16 ¹⁶Do you not know that you are a temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?

Acts 5:3–4 ³But Peter said, "Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and to keep back some of the price of the land?

⁴"While it remained unsold, did it not remain your own? And after it was sold, was it not under your control? Why is it that you have conceived this deed in your heart? You have not lied to men but to God."
