



 - i. in Hebrew meaning –


(house of out pouring)


or

- I. The Setting vs.1
 - A. the location Jerusalem
 - B. the pool vs. 3-4
 - **1.** where multitudes of the sick, blind, lame, and withered came, hoping to be cured. vs.3
 - 2. located just North of the Sheep Gate, close to the temple -
 - 3. water stirred by an angel or an intermittent spring -
 - **4**. for 38 years one man had come here hoping to be cured

- II. The Man's Encounter with Jesus vs. 5-9
 - A. Jesus asks him a simple question
 - > Do you wish to get well? vs. 6
 - B. His response vs. 7
- > "Sir, I have no man to put me into the pool when the water is stirred up, but while I am coming, another steps down before me."

Isaiah 35:5-6a- "Then the eyes of the blind will be opened and the ears of the deaf will be unstopped. Then the lame will leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute will shout for joy."

 - A. The Command get up, pick up, and walk
 - B. The Results vs. 9
 - 1. immediately, he became well as he -
 - 2. obeyed Jesus he got up, picked up his pallet/bed, and began to walk –
 - 3. it was on the Sabbath -

Ex 20:8-11

"Keep the Sabbath day to treat it as holy, as the Lord your God commanded you. For six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath of the Lord your God; you shall not do any work that day, you or your son or your daughter, or your male slave or your female slave, or your ox, your donkey, or any of your cattle, or your resident who stays with you, so that your male slave and your female slave may rest as well as you."

Mark 2:27-28 Jesus said to them, "The Sabbath was made for man, & not man for the Sabbath. So the Son of Man is Lord even of the Sabbath".

 - A. Over the Sabbath -vs. 9b-10
 - B. The Interrogation of the man by the Jewish leaders
 - 1. You broke the Sabbath vs. 10
 - 2. His response & their continued question vs. 11
 - a. He said "He who made me well was the one who said to me, 'pick up your pallet and walk'."
 - b. The Rulers ask "Who is this man?" vs. 12
 - c. He said "I don't know"

Psalm 66:3-4

"I shall come into Your house with burn't offerings; I shall pay You with my vows, which my lips uttered and my mouth spoke when I was in distress."

- V. The Surprise Encounter with Jesus vs. 14
 A. In the Temple vs. 14
 - B. Jesus finds the healed man vs. 14
 - 1. reminds him that he has been healed –
 - 2. tells him to sin no more –
 - 3. so that nothing worse happens to him.

- VI. The Affirmation, Persecution, & Jesus' Response vs. 15-18
 - A. The healed man's actions vs. 15
 - > He told them it was Jesus who had made him well
 - B. The Persecution of Jesus begins vs. 16-18
 - 1. by the Jewish Rulers
 - a. for healing on the Sabbath
 - b. for instructing another to violate the Sabbath
 - C. Jesus' answer vs. 17
 - > "My Father is working until now, and I Myself am working."
 - D. Results, they were seeking all the more to kill Jesus vs.18
