Implications & Applications

- 1. Praise God that our salvation does not depend on us and what we do, but on what God has done through "Christ crucified" a message we must proclaim to those we know who think they can contribute to their eternal destiny though their own efforts.
- 2. Praise God that just as with the Galatians, our justification, sanctification and even our ability to withstand persecution for our faith are all gifts of God's grace received through faith in Christ alone.
- 3. Praise God that from the beginning His promise of blessing to Abraham's descendants was not just to the Jews but to all nations, to all who by faith are spiritual sons of Abraham.
- 4. Praise God that Jesus was willing to take upon Himself the curse we earned by our disobedience. "Jesus paid it all, all to Him I owe!"
