Implications & Applications

- 1. Praise God that He is faithful and His promises stand unchanged forever. Praise Him that He is the same yesterday and today and forever!
- 2. Although God's Law brings condemnation to us as sinners because we routinely violate His perfect standard, in reality it is a gift of His mercy and grace.
- 3. Praise God that by the convicting work of His Spirit, He uses His Law to drive us to our knees and show us our need for Christ.
- 4. We must never let racial, cultural or gender differences divide us. We must maintain a spirit of unity with all our brothers and sisters, for in Christ our standing before God is the same.
- 5. Praise God for the new standing He has given us, accomplished through the life, death, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ.
