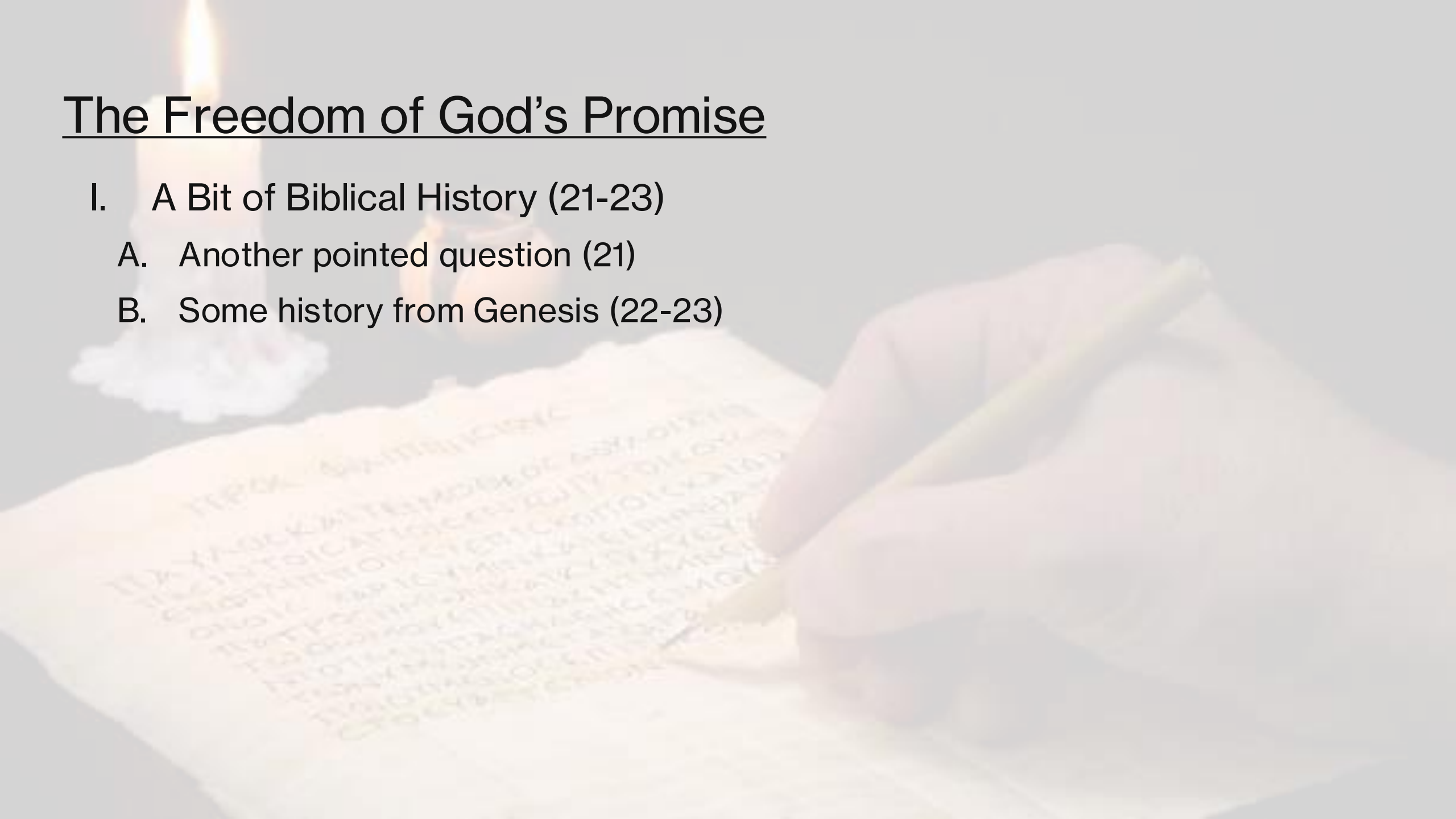

THEME: We have freedom in Christ based solely on what God has done, not on anything we have done

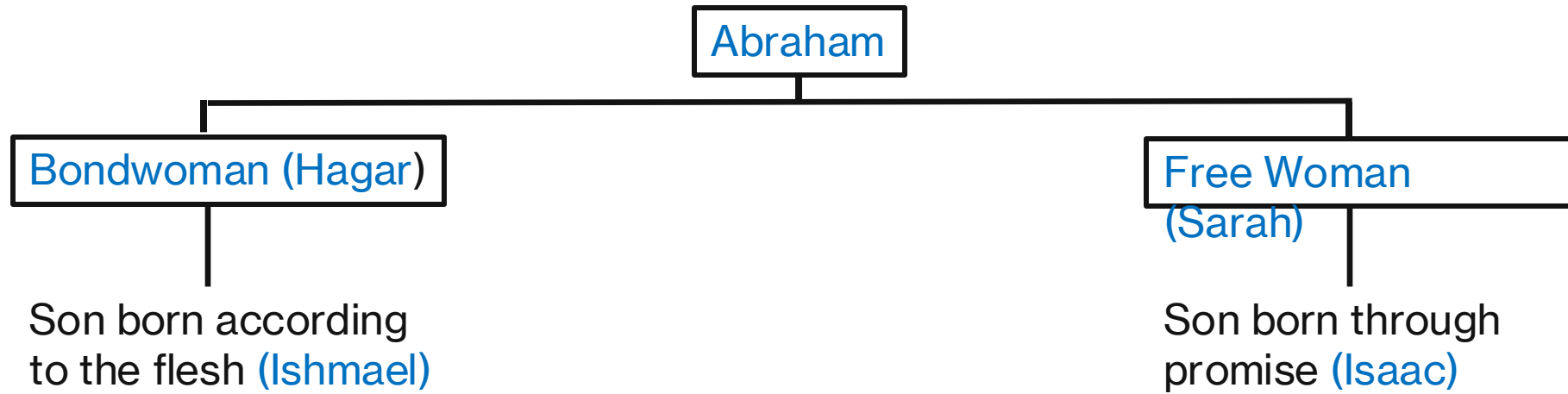


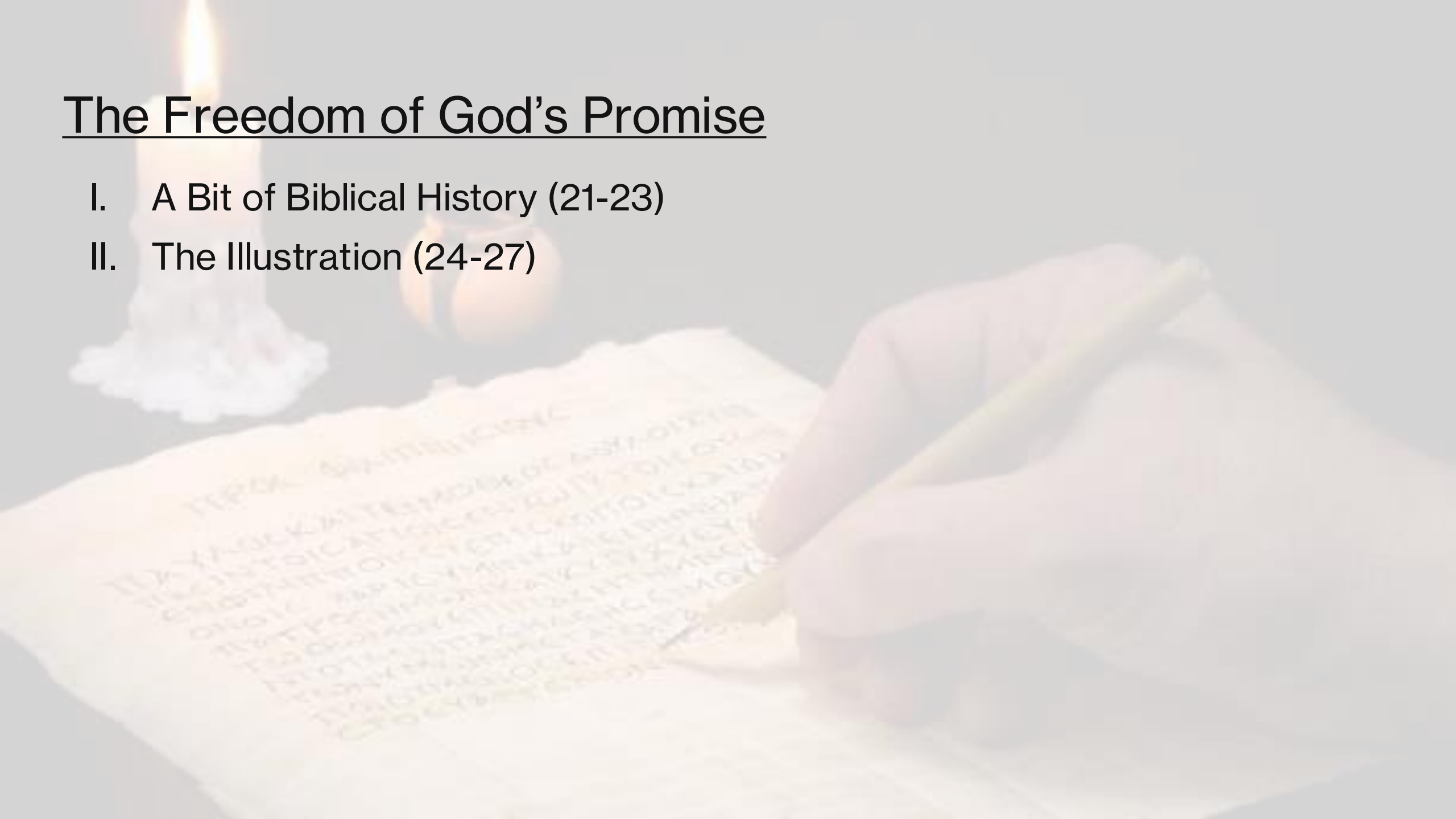
