




Titus 1:9b November 5, 2025



Lesson Theme:

The elder possesses, practices and proclaims God's truth with unwavering conviction.



- I. He Possesses the Truth (The Elder's Conviction)

 - A. Exhort in Sound Doctrine
 - 1. Exhort (parakaleo)
 - To call one alongside
 - 2. Sound Doctrine
 - Sound (Hugiano) that which is whole, healthy, hygienic
 - Doctrine (Didaskalia) the teaching

Elements of Sound Doctrine

- 1. Sound Doctrine is Gospel Centered (1 Tim. 1:8-10)
- 2. Sound Doctrine produces Godliness (1 Tim. 6:3; Tit. 1:13)
- 3. Sound Doctrine MUST be Guarded and Proclaimed (Tit. 1:9; 2:1)

A Study Thru Paul's Letter to Titus

Sound doctrine is important because....

- 1. Our faith is based on a specific message (1 Cor. 15:3-4)
- 2. The gospel is a sacred trust (Phil. 1:27; Jude 3)
- 3. What we believe affects what we do (1 Tim. 1:9-10)
- 4. We must ascertain truth in a world of falsehood (1 John 4:1; Matt. 13:25; Acts 20:29)
- 5. The end of sound doctrine is life (1 Tim. 4:16)
- 6. It encourages believers (Psalm 119:165; Isa. 52:7)

- I. He Possesses the Truth (The Elder's Conviction)

 - B. Refute those who Contradict
 - 1. Refute (elegcho)
 - Bring to light something hidden, (especially sin) with an intention to bring conviction
 - 2. Contradict (antilego)
 - To speak against something, to dispute the truth

Why Refute?

- 1. Preserves the Purity of the Gospel (Gal. 1:6-9; Titus 2:1)
- 2. Strengthens believers in faith and obedience (Rom. 1:11-12; Col. 1:28)
- 3. Silences opposition and stops the spread of false teaching (2 Tim. 4:2-4; Tit. 1:10-11)
- 4. Establishes order and godly authority in the church (1 Tim. 3:2-5; 1 Cor. 14:40)

A STUDY THRU PAUL'S LETTER TO TITUS



"It should be noted that nothing is said about their physical prowess, educational achievements, social status or business acumen...

The picture that emerges of a godly elder is not that of a man who arranges for speakers, disburses funds, contracts for building repairs, and that's all!

The true elder is deeply and vitally involved in the spiritual life of the church by his instruction, exhortation, encouragement, rebuke, and correction."
