

LESSON THEME:

Older women are called to be an example of reverent behavior, demonstrating self-control over their tongues and their substances, and able to teach younger women appropriately.

"a woman older than an adult, but not yet in the last, less productive stage of old age; perhaps between 50 and 60 years old.

III. Older Women Exhorted

"The first behavior cited there (malicious gossips) relates to lack of control of the tongue. The second (drunkenness) relates to a lack of control of both one's appetites and purposes."
