"When I talk about specific areas of acceptable sins, one comment I often hear is that pride is the root cause of all of them. While I agree that pride does play a major role in the development and expression of our subtle sins, I believe there is another sin that is even more basic, more widespread, and more apt to be the root cause of our other sins. That is the sin of ungodliness."

SESSION SUMMARY <u>A BIBLICAL THEOLOGY OF UNGODLINESS</u>

I want to consider a sin that lies at the core of all our sins: ungodliness. My prayer is that the Spirit of God would use His Word to do a work in our hearts, exposing areas that need renovated and renewed for the purpose of godliness.

 - i. 1st You shall have no other God before Me (3)
 - ii. 2nd You shall not perform unprescribed worship (4–6)
 - iii. 3rd You shall not abuse God's name and character (7)

- "When we profess God's name, but do not live answerably to it"
- "When we worship with our lips but not our heart"
- "When we pray but do not believe in him"
- "When our tongues dishonor God"
- "When we make vows or promises and don't keep them"

 - F. It fuels idolatry—"and exchanged the glory of the incorruptible God for an image in the form of corruptible man and of birds and four-footed animals and crawling creatures." (23)
