 - A. Two Kinds of Light
 - 1. The collective light of the lamps of an entire city (14b)
 - 2. The individual light of a lamp in a one-room home (15)
 - B. Two Functions of Light
 - 1. Exposes the filth hidden in darkness
 - 2. Reveals the beauty hidden in darkness

- II. The Point Jesus Makes (14b-16)
 - A. Our Influence Is Inevitable (14b) "cannot be hidden"
 - B. Our Influence Is Intentional (15-16)
 - 1. To Give Light to the World (15)
 - a. To expose what is false and sinful (Jn. 3:19-20)
 - b. To illumine what is true and beautiful (Jn. 3:21)
 - 2. To Bring Glory to the Father (16)

The Misuse of Mt. 5:16

- 1. To justify not sharing the gospel—"just be salt and light"
- 2. To identify the grounds on which we're made right with God
- 3. To focus the church mostly on humanitarian causes
- 4. To summarize the church's primary mission

 - A. Our Message (2 Cor. 4:2-5)
 - B. Our Character (Mt. 5:3-12)
 - C. Our Good Works (Mt. 5:16)
- II. Our Good Works must be Defined by God in His Word (16b)

A Brief Historical Perspective

- 1. Theological Liberalism defined good works solely as improving society, which they called "the social gospel."
- 2. Fundamentalism defined good works as solely proclaiming the gospel.
 - Ultra Fundamentalism
 - Evangelicalism
- 3. The "Emergent Church" defined good works as solely humanitarian causes, which they called "social justice."

- II. Our Good Works must be Defined by God in His Word (16b)
 - A. Only believers can perform good works (Jer. 13:23; Rom. 3:12; 8:7-8; Heb 11:6).
 - B. Good works are evidence of true saving faith (Jam. 2:14, 18, 26).
 - C. Everything a believer does for God's glory is a good work (e.g., Mk. 14:6; 1 Tim. 5:10; 6:18; Titus 2:14).
 - D. Doing good works for unbelievers is not the primary mission of the church (Mt. 28:19-20; Gal. 6:10; 1 Th. 5:15).
