Background

Genesis 25

- Isaac and Rebekah have twin boys, with the Lord revealing that the older will serve the younger
- Esau was born first, followed by Jacob who is holding on to Esau's heel (Jacob's name means "one who takes by the heel")
- Years later, Jacob gets Esau to agree to sell him his birthright in exchange for a meal

Genesis 27

• Isaac is old and sends his oldest son Esau out to hunt and fix him a meal, so that he can bless him before he dies

Background

Genesis 27 (cont'd)

- Rebekah overhears and schemes so that the blessing with go to Jacob
- Jacob then deceives and repeatedly lies to his father in pretending to be Esau
- Isaac gives his blessing to Jacob
- Esau, after finding out that his blessing was stolen, is furious and plans to kill Jacob after Isaac passes
- Rebekah, hearing of Esau's plans, sends Jacob away to Haran and her brother Laban for his own safety, as well as to find a wife

Background

Genesis 28:1-9


- Isaac charges Jacob to find a wife there and offers another blessing to Jacob
- Esau, knowing the daughters of Canaan displease his father, goes and marries a daughter of Ishmael just to spite his father


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Genesis 28:10-22

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- He sees a ladder reaching up to heaven with angels ascending and descending on it (12)
- God appears and passes down to him the covenant promises of Abraham (13-14)
 - Land (13b)
 - Seed (14a)
 - Blessing (14b)
 - Nation (Gen 35:11)

Genesis 35:11 "God also said to him (Jacob), "I am God Almighty; Be fruitful and multiply; A nation and a company of nations shall come from you, And kings shall come forth from you."

- God promises to always be with him no matter where he goes (15)

To mark the significance of the place and event, Jacob ceremonially consecrates the site (16-22)

Reflections as it relates to Christ in the OT

• Jacob's ladder and the opening of access to heaven is a type that anticipates Christ, who opens access permanently

John 1:51 And He said to him, "Truly, truly, I say to you, you will see the heavens opened and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."

Hebrews 10:19–20 ¹⁹Therefore, brethren, since we have confidence to enter the holy place by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰ by a new and living way which He inaugurated for us through the veil, that is, His flesh,

Genesis 28:10-22

Reflections as it relates to Christ in the OT

- Jacob's ladder and the opening of access to heaven is a type that anticipates Christ, who opens access permanently
- God's promises to Jacob echo those given to Abraham and Issac unconditional and all of grace
- God is continuing to narrow in on the genealogy requirements for Messiah, the promised seed, who now will be a descendent of Jacob
- Jesus Christ satisfies this requirement of being a descendant of Abraham, Isaac, and now Jacob

Genesis 28:10-22

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Luke 3:23–34²³When He began His ministry,
Jesus Himself was about thirty years of age, being,
as was supposed, the son of Joseph, the son of Eli,
²⁴the son of Matthat, ...³⁴the son of Jacob, the son
of Isaac, the son of Abraham...

• Jesus Christ satisfies this requirement of being a descendant of Abraham, Isaac, and now Jacob

Interim Events

Genesis 30

- Jacob bears children through Leah, Rachel maid, Leah's maid, and eventually Rachel herself
- God prospers both Laban and Jacob, but Jacob became exceedingly prosperous in devising a plan to increase his flocks

Interim Events

Genesis 31

- Laban's attitude toward Jacob becomes unfriendly and God tells Jacob to return to Canaan
- Jacob and his family and livestock secretly flee for Canaan but later encounter Laban who pursued him
- After an angry exchange between Laban and Jacob, they make a covenant and depart

Genesis 32:3-30

Jacob's anticipated encounter with Esau (3-23)

- Jacob sends messengers to tell his brother Esau that he has many possessions and seeks his brother's favor (3-5)
- The messengers return informing Jacob that Esau is coming to meet him with 400 men (6)
- In fear, Jacob divides his people and possessions into two groups in case they are attacked (7-8)
- Jacob humbly prays to God for deliverance (9-12)
- Jacob sends waves of gifts to Esau in an attempt to appease him (13-21)
- Jacob sends his family and belongings across the stream (22-23)

Genesis 32:3-30

Jacob's unexpected encounter with God (24-30)

• Being left alone, Jacob wrestles with a man (God) all night long (24)

Hosea 12:3—5 ³In the womb he *(Jacob)* took his brother by the heel, And in his maturity he contended with God. ⁴Yes, he wrestled with the angel and prevailed; He wept and sought His favor. He found Him at Bethel And there He spoke with us, ⁵Even the Lord, the God of hosts, The Lord is His name.

Genesis 32:3-30

Jacob's anticipated encounter with Esau (3-23)

Jacob's unexpected encounter with God (24-30)

- Being left alone, Jacob wrestles with a man (God) all night long (24)
- The man (God) touches and dislocates Jacob's thigh socket (25)
- Jacob tells the man he will not let him go until his blesses him (26)
- God changes Jacob's name to Israel (27-29a)
- God blesses Jacob (29b-32)

Genesis 32:3-30

Reflections on this event

- Jacob was a sinful character
- A major crisis and the consequences of his own actions greatly humbled him such that he cried out to God
- This Christophany and wrestling event was designed by God to refine and allow Jacob to demonstrate his heart in wanting God to be his God and for God to bless him
- Jacob is changed and finally worships God as his God
