





Applications from Ephesians

1. Repent and Believe

Ephesians is about God's eternal plan to save sinners and reconcile them to Himself. Have you been saved by His grace, by placing your faith in Christ Jesus?

2. Come and See

Worship God and *marvel* at His rich mercy, His great love, and the riches of His grace in kindness shown to us in Christ Jesus.

3. Go and Do

"Therefore, walk worthy..." The only right response to understanding our position in Christ is to live out our calling in real life! Work hard to walk in unity, in sanctification, in love, in purity, in wisdom, and in strength.
